**PALM/PASSION SUNDAY
APRIL 9, 2017**

WELCOME TO THIS PALM/PASSION SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE!

The service begins with a reenactment of Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. All who are able are invited to join the parade with palms around the outside of the church. If you are sitting on the left side of the nave, you may follow the choir to the left, outside and around to the front and enter all the way down the center aisle, strewing your palms along the aisle on your way up the left aisle back to your seat. If you are sitting on the right side of the nave as you face the front, you are invited to travel out the door on the right and follow the directions above.

Once all have returned to their seats, our service dramatically changes from triumph to the sobering emotions of the passion. This is accentuated with the changing of the Pastor's colors from red to black for the passion reflection. The sermon is the passion reading without added comment. Thank you so much to the passion readers. (Please see insert for cast of characters.)

Thank you to Penny Morken and Connee Zeman for helping with costumes and for directing the Passion reading; and to Betty Baker, Irmi Bjerken (10:30), Pat Cumor, and Judy Kobs, for helping with costumes at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. respectively.

All are welcome for Holy Communion. Communion is continuous at both services (no kneeling). Communion will be served to the congregation by the disciples involved in the dramatic reading of the Passion of Our Lord According to Matthew at six stations. You may go to the station closest to you. Communion will be by intinction (dipping bread into wine or juice from the smaller chalice). Note: Gluten free wafers will be offered at each station.
