They will be collected throughout Collier County and delivered to schools in Collier County, including Immokalee, Children's Advocacy Center, The Shelter for Abused Women & Children, Providence House, Catholic Charities Social Services and Youth Haven, where the most needs have been identified. Last year more than 38 churches/synagogues took part in donating tens of thousands of underwear and socks to the needy in Collier County.
