This was written by an 8-year-old boy named Danny Dutton, who lives in Chula Vista, CA . He wrote it for his third-grade homework assignment, to “explain God.” I wonder if any of us could have done as well?

EXPLANATION OF GOD

“One of God's main jobs is making people. He makes them to replace the ones that die, so there will be enough people to take care of things on earth. He doesn't make grownups, just babies. I think because they are smaller and easier to make. That way he doesn't have to take up his valuable time teaching them to talk and walk. He can just leave that to mothers and fathers.”

“God's second most important job is listening to prayers an awful lot of this goes on, since some people, like preachers and things, pray at times besides bedtime. God doesn't have time to listen to the radio or TV because of this. Because he hears everything, there must be a terrible lot of noise in his ears, unless he has thought of a way to turn it off.”

They finally got tired of him preaching to them and they crucified him. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES FOR MAY 9, 2017

The meeting was called to order by President, Marty Roddy, at 5:30 p.m. Members in attendance: John Burgbacher, Tom Dunlop, Carole Graesser by phone, Joanne Hogan, Chuck Keller, Judy Kobs, Ron Modjeska, Marty Roddy, Linda Tidmore, and Tony Zeman. Also in attendance was Pastor Douglas Wahlberg. Absent was Pat Cumor. Devotions were given by Joanne Hogan. In a motion by John Burgbacher and seconded by Tom Dunlop, the minutes of the April meeting were approved as editorially changed. There were no changes to the agenda. Pastor's report: Pastor Wahlberg thanked the Council for their support and prayers following his recent surgery. He is back to doing visitations and recovering slowly. The Florida-Bahamas Synod Assembly will be October 12-14. Nadine Kelly and Lynn Wahlberg will be delegates from Shepherd of the Glades. An eclectic group of new members joined Easter Sunday. Our congregation is to be commended for being a welcoming congregation. May 23, 2017 will mark the beginning of Pastor Wahlberg's ninth year at Shepherd of the Glades.

Team Reports:

Accounting-Tony Zeman reports that we are in extremely good shape at this time. We may not have a deficit this summer. Upon a motion by Tom Dunlop and seconded by Ron Modjeska, the Treasurer's report was accepted.

Parish Relations – No report

Endowment – Marty Roddy reported that there is currently \$105,413.49 in the Endowment Fund.

Property – Ron Modjeska reported that a new John Deere mower would be delivered on May 10, 2017. It cost \$5,000. On Monday, May 15, 2017, work will begin on replacing light bulbs in the sanctuary, as well as in Hanson Hall. Upkeep of bushes is an ongoing job.

Stewardship – Chuck Keller says the theme, "A Beacon of Light", may be used again next year for the stewardship campaign.

Fellowship – Joanne Hogan stated the activities have ended for this year. The committee will meet this summer to plan the calendar of activities for 2017-2018.

Education – Judy Kobs reported the committee met Sunday, May 7, 2017 and reviewed the past year. Barbara Keller led a training session on "Safe Church". Rally Day is being planned.

Evangelism – The committee met on April 21, 2017 and Linda Tidmore said five places would be interviewed to choose a recipient for the Giving Tree at Christmas time. Pastor Wahlberg said Faith Lutheran in Lehigh Acres may visit again this summer and provide music and sweets for coffee time.

Worship and Music – No report.

Sew-Sews – No report.

Lead On Lord – Tom Dunlop reported that several projects were planned: New carpet for the worship center, parking lot painting and sealing.

New Business:

The Church does not have an AED. The main building, as well as Hanson hall should have them. Chuck Keller and Top Dunlop are to investigate and discuss the matter at another meeting.

Old Business:

Everglades Chorus - \$750 has been received from Everglades Chorus as rent for next year's concert and rehearsals.

Also in attendance was Pastor Douglas Wahlberg. Absent were Pat Cumor, Tom Dunlop, and Ron Modjeska.

Devotions were given by Linda Tidmore. In a motion by Tony Zeman and seconded by Chuck Keller, the minutes of the May 9, 2017 meeting were approved. There were no changes to the agenda.

Pastor's report: Pastor Wahlberg said that Keith Scamehorn is helping with sound and lights each Sunday morning. Pastor questioned having Forums this January. Three or four people have requested a time. The Council decided, that to increase attendance, to have the coffee time inside on Forum Sundays. The Forums would be January 7, 14, 21, 28, 2018. Old Business:

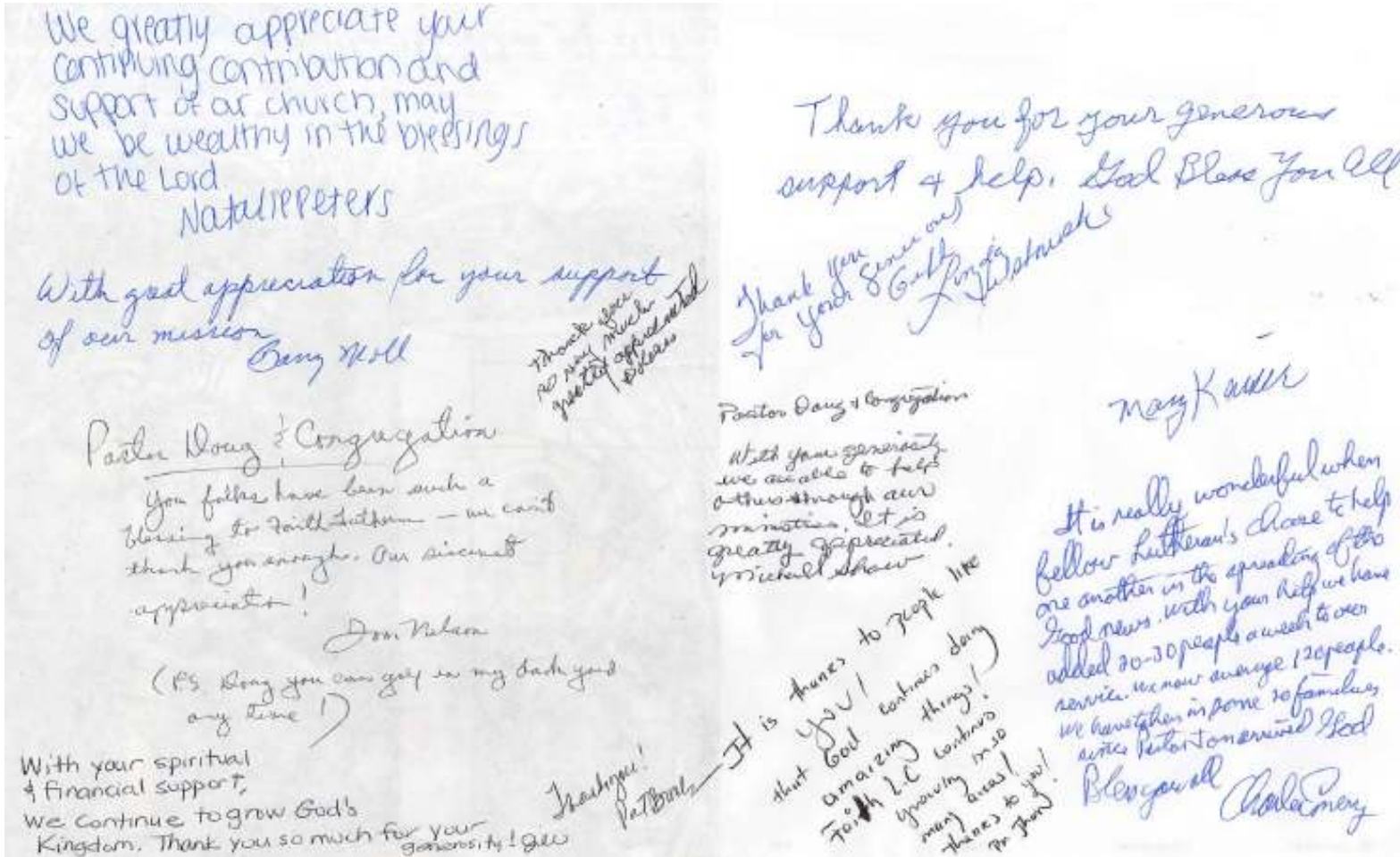

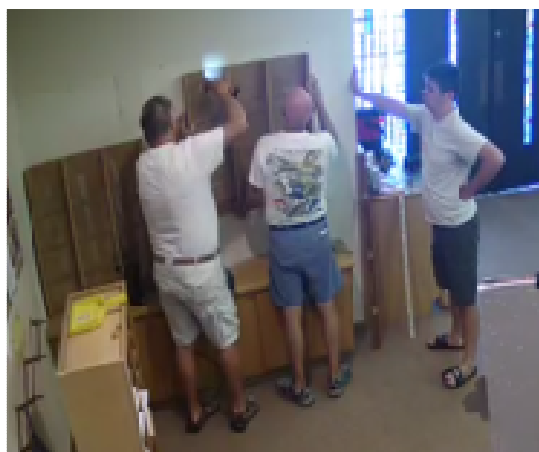

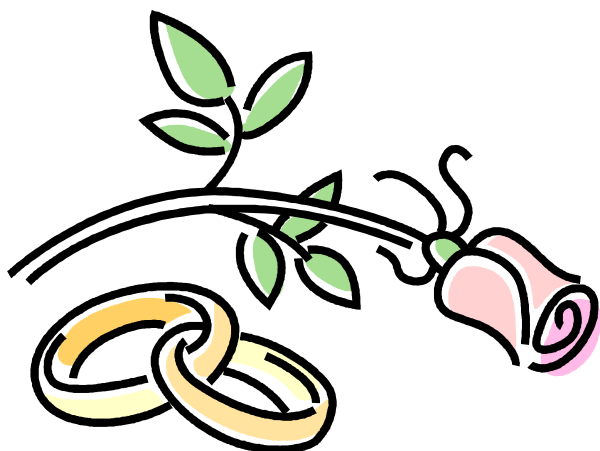
