GETTING CLOSER TO EASTER!

“Jesus will claim and change us!”

Mark Oldenburg writes in “Sundays & Seasons: Preaching” the following:

“From now until Passion Sunday, the gospel reading will be a passion prediction of some sort. This is the only one from Mark; future weeks’ will come from John. And, unlike future weeks’, Mark warns that Jesus’ suffering has implications for the lives of his followers. Being a follower of Jesus includes, says he, a willingness to put aside one’s own desires and hopes and take on the suffering that identification with the least and the lost will bring. Following Jesus does not mean simply entertaining certain theological propositions or discovering hidden ways to make friends and influence people. Rather, it means emulating him, as far as we can, in his own path of self-emptying. We need to be careful here - not all suffering is the cross, and not all suffering is simply to be accepted. But if we are following Jesus for what we can get out of it, then we are not following Jesus. We do people no favor if we invite them to the font or the table without warning them that the relationship they find there will claim, change, and in many ways ruin their lives. To reboot means that you shut down the system.”



The above sounds to me like “The Theology of the Cross”.

FEBRUARY 13, 2018 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 5:32 p.m. by Vice President, "Pete" Peterson. Members in attendance: Larry Buettner, Pat Cumor, Tom Dunlop, Joanne Hogan, Pete Peterson, and Tony Zeman. Members absent: Ron Modjeska and Linda Tidmore. Pastor Doug Wahlberg was also in attendance. Devotions were given by "Pete" Peterson. The minutes of the January 9, 2018 meeting were approved as printed. Pastor's report: Pastor Wahlberg noted that attendance for 2017 was down from 2016. However, January, 2018 is higher than January, 2017, which is good news. The Council decided to meet some Saturday to pare the membership list of inactive members. Services for the Lenten season are ready using the theme, "Theology of the Cross". Synod Assembly will be June 1, 2, 3, 2018 in Kissimee. Delegates are to be determined at the March Council meeting.

Team Reports:

Accounting-Tony Zeman said we ended 2017 with a bang. January and February offerings continue to be very good. An estate gift will be used to pay insurance premiums for the next three years. A representative from our insurance company is coming to the March meeting to talk about flood and named storm insurance. Excess from the Hurricane Funds will be put in a reserve fund for catastrophes.

Parish Relations – Pete Peterson said he had asked Bonnie Brisky and Bruce Kobs to be members of the committee. Staff evaluations are to be considered at the March meeting.

Endowment – Pete Peterson said Alan Rowold would be the chairman of the committee. There is \$116,605 in the fund.

Property – Tom Dunlop reported that all shrubs have been trimmed and new mulch put down. The soffit and fascia have been repaired. Lights in high areas were replaced while the lift was on site. Trash left over from that job is to be cleaned up soon.

Stewardship – Tom Dunlop reported that 66 pledges had been received with a pledged giving of \$156,058. 51 time and talent forms were received. Tom, Chuck Keller, and Don Bassett had looked at projectors and screens that could be permanently installed. They would probably cost between \$10,000 and \$15,000.

Fellowship – Joanne Hogan reported that the Strawberry Sunday was successful. The Fellowship Committee will provide soup for Ash Wednesday. Church Council has soup on March 7, 2018. Six members volunteered to make soup.

Education – Larry Buettner reported he had met with Lori Bernabei, Bonny Dery, and Nadine Kelly. They said someone was needed to take over the Cradle Roll. They also need a new Sunday School teacher. They also asked for a policy to be stated as to who is responsible for children in the nursery.

Evangelism – No report.

Worship and Music – No report.

New Business:

Council Meeting Times – This will be discussed at the next meeting.

RHF – This will be discussed at the next meeting.

Nominating Committee – This will be discussed at the next meeting.

Everglades Chorus Request – The Chorus has requested the use of Hanson Hall after the second concert for a dinner for the members and guests from 9-11:00 p.m. The Council voted against this because of the lateness of the activity.

The next Council meeting will be March 13, 2018 at 5:30 p.m. Devotions will be given by Larry Buettner. In a motion by Tom Dunlop and seconded by Tony Zeman, the meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m. The meeting closed with a prayer by Pastor Wahlberg.

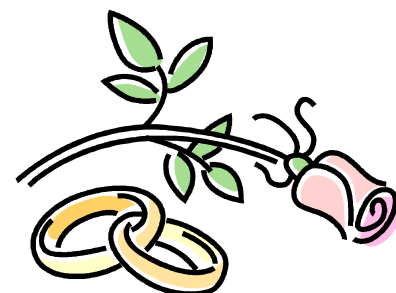

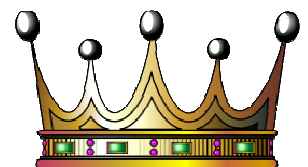
