COUNCIL'S CORNER . . .

MAY 1, 2018 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 5:25 p.m. by President, Ron Modjeska. Members in attendance: Tom Dunlop, Joanne Hogan, Ron Modjeska, Pete Peterson, Linda Tidmore, and Tony Zeman. Members absent: Larry Buettner and Pat Cumor. Also in attendance: Pastor Douglas Wahlberg; Assistant to the Bishop, Connie Schmucker; and Lynn Dickerman. Devotions and opening prayer were given by Joanne Hogan.

Mrs. Connie Schmucker was introduced to the Council, and she explained the process to go through to call a new pastor. The Council is to be very involved in the early part of the process, even before a call committee is appointed. A farewell event must be planned. An interim pastor will be appointed. (This will be after September 1, 2018, as Pastor Wahlberg has that much exit time.) A church profile will be prepared. Mrs. Schmucker left a notebook with the process completely explained. This part of the meeting closed with a prayer by Mrs. Schmucker, who left at 6:25 p.m. Mrs. Dickerman also left.

The meeting reconvened. In a motion by Tom Dunlop and seconded by Linda Tidmore, the minutes of the April 10, 2018 meeting were adopted.

Pastor's report: Pastor Wahlberg said invitations for a birthday and retirement party were distributed. This party will be hosted by Pastor and Mrs. Wahlberg at Old Soul Brewing Company on May 21, 2018, 4:00-7:00 p.m. Megan has asked Pastor Wahlberg to have First Communion for Thomas Cianflone. Pastor Wahlberg will do this and invite other young people to join in the event. A date has not been set. He and his immediate family are responsible for the Wahlberg Reunion this summer. Planning is taking place now. He also said he would attend the SOTG Minnesota Gathering on July 23, 2018 to say goodbye to those people. The ELCA now has a giving app which makes it possible to give anywhere from any device.

Team Reports:

Accounting-Tony Zeman reported that Holy Week collections, as well as Easter, did not get reported until April. Holy Week giving was up over last year. Under expenses, administrative costs are up due to purchasing of attendance pads for the pews and giving envelopes. In a motion by Pete Peterson and seconded by Tom Dunlop the treasurer's report was received and filed for audit.

Endowment – Pete Peterson reports the Endowment fund is approximately \$114,000. He also said the committee needs one more person. Ken Sebe will be asked to join the committee.

Property – Ron Modjeska reported that the property is in good shape. The roofs have all been repaired. Tom Davis, our lawn caretaker, fell and also had some surgery to remove skin cancer, but the lawn mower is in the shop for repairs and by the time it is ready, Tom will be ready to mow again.

The other teams had no reports.

New Business:

There was no new business.

Old Business:

Audio-Visual System-Tom Dunlop reported the audio-visual system approved by the Worship and Music Committee had a donor willing to give \$10,000 if the congregation would match it. This would pay the major part of the expense. It was decided to delay any action on this until after the interim pastor arrives.

In a motion by Tom Dunlop and seconded by Pete Peterson, the meeting adjourned at 7:21 p.m. and closed with a prayer by Pastor Wahlberg.

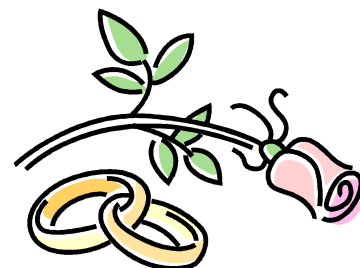

REPORT FROM SYNOD ASSEMBLY . . .

Report on 2018 Florida-Bahamas Synod Meeting, June 1-3

Thank you, Shepherd of the Glades Congregation, for allowing me to be your voting delegate at this year's assembly. All meetings were held in the Embassy Suites where we stayed, which made it convenient to attend all scheduled meetings. The first meeting was Friday at 11 a.m. to explain the schedule and voting process. Then at 1 p.m. we assembled for the 1st Plenary Session with the Welcome, Credentials Report, Adoption of Rules, Adoption of Agenda, Nominations, Bishop's Report, Portico Moment, Churchwide Report, and announcements. This session lasted until time for Opening Eucharist. Then at 7:30 p.m., we again assembled and had the first ballot voting and the Keynote Address by Reverend David Lose. He spoke on "telling your story" as the best way to witness!

Saturday our second session began at 8 a.m. again with reports from the Vice President of the Synod, Global Mission Report, Youth and Treasurer's Reports, and voting results. David Lose again spoke and explained how the Bible is a "collection of stories" and we should share it; there are two kinds of truths - the narrative and the factual or scientific truths. Both are important to "share the story" as we witness to our neighbors. The afternoon sessions were workshops, and I attended the workshop on our church's "Women and Social Justice" global mission statement and the workshop on "Congregational Vitality". Again, witnessing to our neighbors and the world was emphasized. Saturday evening was a "death by chocolate" event for all attending, which was, of course, delicious!

Sunday we checked out of the hotel prior to attending the 8:30 a.m. gathering for the voting reports and another ballot to determine the final people to be on the Synod Council. We closed with a worship service after the young people were introduced who will be working at the Youth Camp this summer. After communion, we journeyed back to our home in Naples.

The mission of the church is so in line with my own personal beliefs. I felt encouraged to hear ideas so well expressed that I hold dear. It is an honor to attend, and I encourage others to volunteer for this great experience.
