Note: Gluten free wafers are now offered as well.

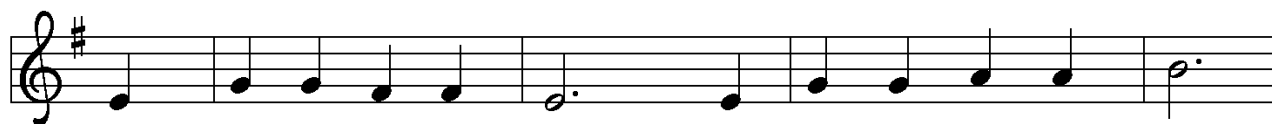

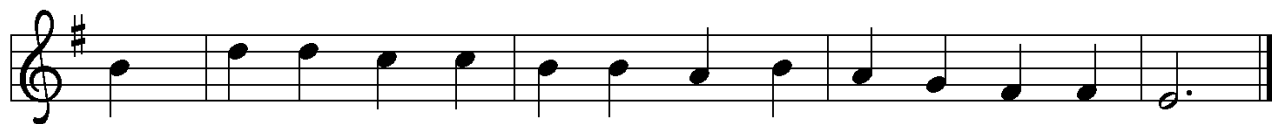


