## PASTOR'S PAGE . . .

As of September 1, I began my ministry among the people of Shepherd of the Glades as Intentional Interim Pastor. I have been appointed by our Florida – Bahamas Synod Council. This appointment is far different from being called as Pastor. My ministry here is to assist our congregation in its search for and call of a permanent pastor.



Everyone is called by God. At Baptism the Holy Spirit enters our lives to fill us with God's resurrection life.

The Spirit gives us trust in the presence and power of God in our lives, in the lives of others, and in the life of the entire world. God desires that we are in relationship with him. God cares for us individually and deeply. In baptism we are called to proclaim the Gospel and to follow Christ's example of humble service and love for others. All of us possess this high calling. We express this calling in many different ways.

We live out our baptismal calling as married people and parents. Our occupations and relationships with family, friends, and all other people demonstrate our relationship with God. As baptized people we express God's call and relationship with us in all that we do.

The Office of Pastor is given to the church as a way to see to it that the means of grace, the Word and Sacraments, are made available to the people in a regular and orderly fashion. It is an Office established by God and authorized by God's church. There are two parts to the call to the Office of Pastor. The first is internal: the Holy Spirit leads an individual to consider serving God. The second is external: the church calls an individual to service of God. Ordination is the public and external recognition of one's internal call to service within the church of God. To call a pastor to Shepherd of the Glades is very different from hiring an employee. Calling a pastor should not be confused with secular hiring practices.

Lutherans are firmly convinced that the Holy Spirit plays the major role in the decision about who is the most appropriate person to provide pastoral ministry in any particular place. Guided by the Spirit, the Office of our Bishop, the call committee, and pastoral candidates seek to discern God's will for the mission and ministry of this particular congregation, Shepherd of the Glades.

Martin Luther gave the following advice to those seeking a pastor:

*"Act in this way: first beseech God with prayers, both individual and in common. For this is a great undertaking, and the magnitude of it, rather than its novelty, impresses me. When you have so prayed, have no doubt that God to whom you have prayed is faithful and will give what you ask, opening to the one who knocks and granting to the one who seeks (Matthew 7:8). Thus, you may be assured that you are not pushing this matter - but being pushed in it [by the Spirit]."*

Great and Holy God, send us the pastor you have chosen for us. Amen

# **COUNCIL'S CORNER . . .**

## **AUGUST 14, 2018 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**

The meeting was called to order at 5:35 p.m. by President, Ron Modjeska. Members present: Joanne Hogan, Ron Modjeska, Pete Peterson, Linda Tidmore, and Tony Zeman; by phone was Larry Buettner. Absent were: Pat Cumor and Tom Dunlop. Also in attendance were Pastor Bob Hoffman and Chuck Keller.

Devotions were given by Pastor Bob. In a motion by Tony Zeman and seconded by Linda Tidmore, the minutes of the June 13, 2018 were approved.

Pastor Bob reported that five primary areas of focus for the interim ministry are:

- Putting the congregation's history into perspective
- Claiming a clear identity in God's call and mission - The all church retreat will be important in this. This needs to be scheduled to get as many congregants as possible involved.
- Supporting congregational leadership shifts and changes
- Strengthening the relationship with our synod and our church wide expression
- Deepening commitments to new pastoral leadership and the future

Pastor Bob distributed a "Congregational Sustainability Assessment". Assignments were made to complete this report. The all church retreat was scheduled for Sunday, October 28, 2018 after worship with lunch provided.

Team reports:

Accounting - Tony Zeman reported that receipts for July were about \$10,000 below projected amount. Expenses were over in only one area, property, due to maintenance of air conditioners. The report was accepted.

Endowment - Pete Peterson reported that the Endowment fund is up to \$115, 748 in July, 2018.

Property - Ron Modjeska said he had contacted Conditioned Air to get a bid for servicing our air conditioning equipment. Ceiling tiles in Hanson Hall are being replaced. This will be taken out of the Irma Fund. Weeds are being worked on.

Parish Relations, Stewardship, Fellowship, Education, Evangelism/Publicity, Worship & Music, and LOL Committees did not have reports.

New Business:

Update of Bank Signers - In a motion by Pete Peterson and seconded by Larry Buettner, BB&T will be notified that Cindy Quehl, Don Bassett, and Tony Zeman are the only people who can sign checks

Disaster Response Plan - We need to devise a plan whereby our members can be contacted in case of an emergency, such as Irma.

Call Committee - Some thought is being given to how the six members and two alternates will function. This will be worked out soon.

Old Business:

Update of the Constitution - The editorial changes have been made and sent to Michele Hilton, who will present it to the Synod Council in September.

Safe Church Policy - We have a policy for our nursery, as well as one for our congregation.

Audio/Visual System - Chuck Keller reported that he had been advised that a \$7,200 system would be adequate for our use. A projector is to be installed on the back wall with a computer in the sound room. The system will be paid for by an anonymous gift. A motion was made, seconded and approved to proceed with the purchase of the A/V system. Megan Cianflone has indicated an interest in operating the system and could be given a stipend for this additional duty.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to adjourn the meeting at 7:10 p.m. The meeting closed with prayer.

## **FAITHFUL STEWARDS . . .**

Paul Smith, one of our members, wrote the following article in light of tax law changes and charitable giving. You may find it helpful.

### Tax Law Changes and Charitable Giving

The new Federal Income Tax Law that became effective this year for 2018 income raised the standard deduction for single or married people filing separately to \$12,000 and for married people filing jointly or surviving spouses to \$24,000. There is also an additional standard deduction for the aged (over 65) and blind of \$1,300.

Because of these higher amounts, many people who previously itemized their deductions for things such as charitable contributions, state and local taxes and interest will find that the standard deduction is more generous than the total of what they can now deduct. However, for those who are over 70 1/2 years of age who have IRAs, 401Ks, 403Bs, etc. from which they have to take Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) each year, there is a way of continuing to deduct contributions to churches and other qualified charities in addition to the new standard deduction.

If the contributions are made directly from these retirement accounts to the charities, they are not subject to income tax. For example if you have to take a \$10,000 RMD, it is taxed at regular rates. If instead you make a \$4,000 contribution, this portion would not be taxed, and you would only have to show \$6,000 as the taxable amount of the RMD on your tax return. You would still fulfill the requirement to take your full RMD, but the contributed portion would be tax free. In effect, you get the full standard deduction plus before tax treatment of the contribution from your retirement account; in this example, an additional \$4,000.

One way of taking advantage of this tax break would be to make direct contributions to churches and charities from these retirement accounts before the end of this year. (Charles Schwab for instance makes this easy by issuing checks that you can use to draw directly on your retirement accounts for charitable contributions.) You might consider pre-paying your 2019 pledge using a lump sum contribution from your retirement account in 2018. If this sounds confusing, please contact your tax professional and also the company with which your retirement funds are invested for more information. Hopefully this additional tax break might enable you to share some of the tax savings with the churches and other institutions to which you contribute in the form of more generous contributions.
