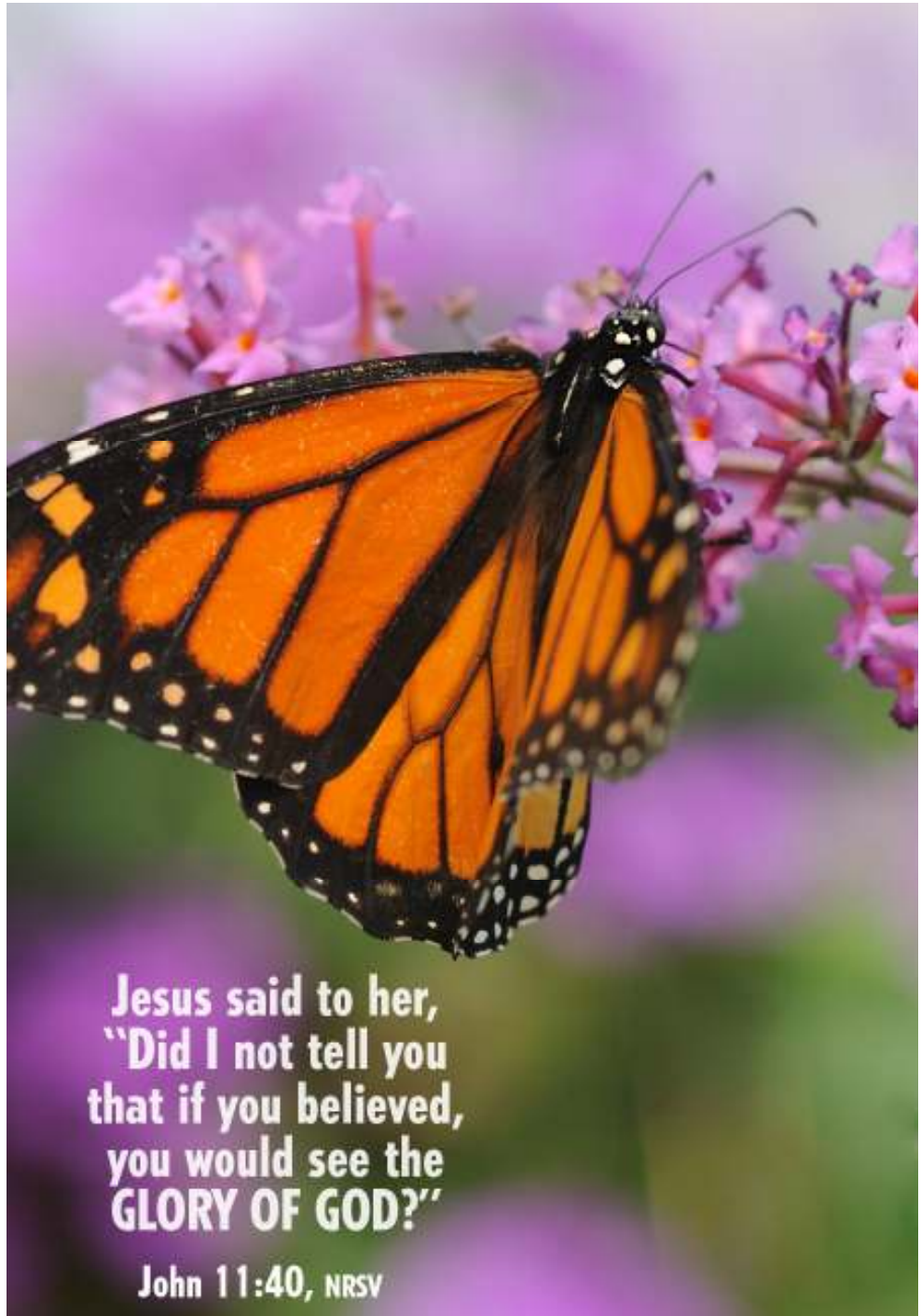

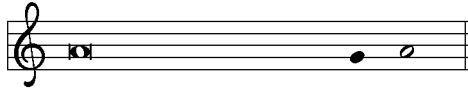

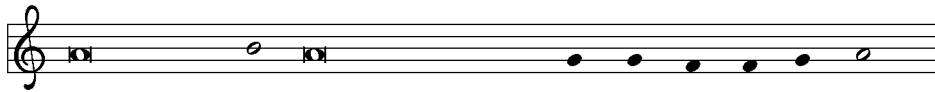

LIFE LINE SCREENING

Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community based preventive health screenings will be in our community on Wednesday, November 14, 2018 at Shepherd of the Glades Lutheran Church. Ultrasound screenings to identify risk factors for cardiovascular disease include; Carotid Artery (plaque buildup-a leading cause of stroke), Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (an enlargement or weak area in the main blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the rest of the body), Peripheral Arterial Disease (hardening of the arteries in the legs), a Heart Rhythm Screening (an EKG to detect Atrial Fibrillation-irregular heartbeat), and an Osteoporosis Risk Assessment for men and women. FROM PASTOR BOB

A colleague, Pastor Brett Ballenger of Prince of Peace Lutheran in Marlton, NJ, shared this:

This past week in our nation we have seen multiple instances of hatred and bias motivated crimes of terror and violence. I know that each of you may be exasperated and demoralized by the continuation of such inhumanity and barbarity. Yet, in the face of this we must be renewed with the truth voiced by Bishop Desmond Tutu:

“Victory is Ours.

Goodness is stronger than evil;

Love is stronger than hate;

Light is stronger than darkness;

Life is stronger than death;

Victory is ours through the One who loves us.”

Friends, we cannot fight fire with fire, hatred with hatred, or violence with violence. We must find and implement creative ways to: reduce the heat of the fire, remove the fuel from the fire, and restrict the air to the fires of fear, misunderstanding, and hatred.

The Trinity

The Father: To the left of the cross is the open hand of God, giving all life and creation, the sun, the moon, and the stars, all creatures great and small, and things needed to sustain us on His earth.

The Son: The cross, gold for the glory of the resurrection, dominates the art. Around the center of this is red for the blood of Christ's sacrifice.

The Holy Spirit: In the upper right hand corner is the dove, symbol of the Holy Spirit

The Sacraments

Holy Communion: Below the dove, the communion chalice is shown, with the wheat and grapes, the bread and wine of communion, the body and blood of Christ.

Baptism: To the left of the cross is the shell, ancient symbol of baptism. Through water as a never ending river of blessing, it flows through our lives.

Our Faith

The swirling lines of movement throughout remind us that our faith is never still.
