PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

It has been a consistent Christian practice during Lent to engage in personal spiritual and practical practices to help prepare for the celebration of Easter. Following long-standing Roman Catholic tradition, the Lutheran church has been known to adopt the three practices of *prayer*, *fasting* and *giving*.

Prayer

Beginning last summer, I introduced the Ways to be Faithful with the Lord. These are listed



on the poster in the Narthex of church, clearly visible as you enter to worship. They are also listed in our worship bulletin nearly every Sunday. Daily prayer is near the top of the list. Praying daily is a practice that aids us in seeking and doing God's will for us. It also gives us the inspiration to reach out to others and to work for justice and peace in the world, starting with our daily lives.

There are many resources available that will help those who would like to adopt a daily habit of prayer. I host a daily email prayer group. If you are interested in joining in, simply share your email address with me and I will email you a reminder to pray every day. There are also print resources that we can order for you. One is *Lasting Hope: Devotions for Lent 2019*. There are two pages for each day from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday. This resource anchors prayer in Sacred Scripture, provides a simple point to ponder, continues with a short reflection, and ends with a suggested prayer for the day. Luther Seminary provides a daily meditation entitled *God Pause*. This is also emailed to you. Go to the seminary website *luthersem.edu*. There you will find a link to its daily prayer and other Lenten resources.

<u>Fasting</u>

This practice is more than: "What are you going to give up during Lent?" My mother always gave up sweets and milk products during Lent and she always lost some weight. Unfortunately, she also lost bone mass and developed osteoporosis later in life. She came from a generation that paid less attention to prevention of conditions than we do today. It was a good attempt at a good practice. The spiritual dimension of fasting is that depriving ourselves of a favorite food, or favorite pastime, or any other pleasurable facet of our lives helps us remember that there are some people that do not have much to give up. We can identify better with the needy when we practice being in need ourselves.

Giving

Many people tie their fasting with their giving. If I indulge less in one of my favorite beverages, the cappuccino from the machine at the convenient store, I spend less on myself. I take what I might spend on myself and give that money to Lutheran World Relief or Lutheran Disaster Relief. I make use of money I would have spent on myself to help people in need. This becomes less a physical, pride-filled practice when I

unite it with my prayer and fasting. God provides me with everything I have. I give back the blessings provided me by God in order to bless others. This is good stewardship.

Lent gives us opportunities to Return to the Lord. Follow Jesus.

A PICTURE IS WORTH A THOUSAND WORDS . . .

AUDIO/VISUAL SYSTEM FOR SOTG LUTHERAN

"One picture is worth a 1000 words." Tom Dunlop and I realized that when we began planning for our Stewardship Program a few years ago. Two years later, we now have an AV system in the sanctuary with which we are learning to enhance the worship experience. We were helped by talking with Emmanuel Lutheran and using their "best practices." Their deacon, Jim Cooper, helped train our new AV staff, Andrew Lingsch and Zach Soto. During the week, Andrew designs the "slides" or playlist that will be shown at Sunday services. He is experimenting with fonts, colors, number of words on a slide and all the factors needed to make a slide. Don Bassett is giving guidance by "editing the slides" to make them easy to read with minimal of verbiage. Zack Soto is here Sunday mornings to "show" the playlist, adjust the sound, lighting, and all the other elements to create a better worship experience. We are starting with the announcements before the service, and we were pleased to see Pastor Tara McGraw use the AV to show graphics in her message to the congregation. Teen Challenge also used the AV system by describing their work with addictions. If you have other ideas about using the AV system, please let us know.

LENT 2019...

In Lent, 2019 the central theme of Lenten Wednesdays will be "Perfect Love Casts Out Fear". Wednesday evening prayer and reflection is rooted in the order for Evening Prayer. Each week provides a pair of complimentary readings from sacred Scripture as the center point for reflection. These readings explore different dimensions of God's love for us and the love of Christ we share. The schedule is as follows:



Ash Wednesday, March 6—Worship with Holy Communion and imposition of ashes

First Week of Lent, March 13-"Love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19) and "Love does no wrong to a neighbor (Romans 13)

Second Week of Lent, March 20-"When Israel was a child, I loved him" (Hosea 11) and "Who will separate us from the love of Christ?" (Romans 8)

Third Week of Lent, March 27-"Love immigrants because you were immigrants in Egypt" (Deuteronomy 10) and "Love your enemies" (Luke 6)

Fourth Week of Lent, April 3-"If I have faith but do not have love, I am nothing" (1 Corinthians 13) and "If you love me you will keep my commandments" (John 14)

<u>Fifth Week of Lent</u>, April 10-"It was not because you were greater that the Lord loved you" (Deuteronomy 7) and "Perfect love casts out fear" (1 John 4)

Holy Week,-Evening celebration of Maundy Thursday, April 18 and Good Friday, April 19

COUNCIL'S CORNER . . .

SHEPHERD OF THE GLADES LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES February 12, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 5:26 p.m. by Vice President, Pete Peterson. Members in attendance: Pat Cooper, Pat Cumor, Tom Dunlop, Paul Hashagen, Earnie Keller, Pete Peterson, Keith Scamehorn, Doug Walck, and Tony Zeman. Pastor Bob Hoffman was also in attendance. Absent was Larry Buettner.

Devotions were given by Pastor Bob from the weekly World in Prayer. The minutes were approved as corrected, adding Doug Walck in attendance at the last meeting.

Pastor's report: Pastor Bob reported that he was there for the Call Committee's interviewing training. He stated that they did a really good job. Things are coming along and the committee is getting some experience in how to interview our next prospective pastor. He has conducted one internment, two funerals, with another memorial service this coming Saturday.

Team reports:

<u>Finance</u> - Tony Zeman reported that our offerings are down 19% but our attendance is also down 28%. Tony said that we found a new auditor who will do the job at the same rate we have paid in the past. <u>Property</u> - Doug Walck reported that they removed the raw insulation in the garage because it was falling down. They reorganized the bench and cleaned the floor in the shed. They are looking at the tools to get rid of those that are old and replace them with new ones. There is a need for another trash container since the one we have is always overflowing after an event. They are getting a shipment of mulch next week.

<u>Stewardship</u> - Tom Dunlop reported we received 53 pledge cards this year. Last year we had 66, but we are still receiving pledge cards by mail.

Fellowship - Earnestine Keller reported that our annual Strawberry Sunday after both services will be Sunday, Sunday, February 24. (This was later changed to March 3.) Soup suppers begin with Ash Wednesday on March 6 and Fellowship Committee providing soup; March 13-Choir; March 20-Sew-Sews and Property; March 27-Council; April 3-Bible Study groups and Call Committee; April 10– Staff, pastors, and office volunteers. Holy Week there will be no soup supper.
