

# PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

As we journey through Lent, it is interesting to contemplate so many various traditions in the congregation and the history of Christianity regarding this Holy Season. Lent is traditionally a time the Church "buries" the Alleluia banners and does not sing or speak the "A" word again until Easter morning. Lent has traditionally been a time for fasting and prayer; a time to remember that we are dust, and to dust we shall return. Lent is also traditionally a time of preparation for Baptism for adults who have not been Baptized. As a child, I remember the strange sensation that something was different in the Church as there were no Baptisms and no Alleluia's during the 40 days of Lent. These 40 Holy days between Ash Wednesday and Easter are to represent the 40 days of fasting and prayer that Jesus did in the desert just prior to His Baptism. But as a child, I could never figure out how the Church said there are only 40 days of Lent,



when there are really 46 days. I later learned that in the early Christian Church, it was forbidden to fast on the day of Christ's resurrection, and Mass is a celebration. So Sundays are a day of celebration of the resurrection and are not included in the count of the 40 days. Six weeks, times six days of the week, plus Ash Wednesday through Saturday equals 40 days. When I learned Sundays were excluded, and I had given up candy or ice cream for Lent, I loved Sundays!

The times have changed, and so have our traditions. Not all churches continue the tradition of burying the Alleluia during Lent. Some even sing the "A" word in the liturgy during Lent. Some congregations celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Baptism during Lent, and very few hold adult catechism classes to prepare adults for Baptism on Easter Sunday. But there are some traditions that continue to linger. The idea of fasting from something or giving something up for Lent continues to be a tradition for many Christians. Many people do this without even knowing why they give up something other than it has always been a tradition during Lent. Think about your Catholic friends who do not eat meat on Friday during Lent. How many of them faithfully fast from meat on Friday without knowing the reason? Although I have never been a big fan of many traditions of Lent, it is my hope that the Church never abandons the idea of fasting and praying in preparation for Easter. I am hopeful that this tradition is about fasting from things that distract us or even prevent us from living out our faith in Jesus Christ.

I recently saw a television screen in a Church welcoming center that had the word, "Blessed" highlighted in large letters. Then the sign used technology to drop the letter "B" at the beginning and the "ed" at the end, leaving the word, "less." Maybe the core of being blessed, is letting go and fasting from the things that prevent us from loving God with our whole heart, soul and might and loving our neighbor as ourselves. This teaching of having less in order to be blessed is certainly not what we are taught in our culture. We are taught that if we have more, we are happy and blessed; more money, more house, more independence, more stuff. But we know and have seen that this is not true. People who have the greatest wealth in the world have not found happiness in their wealth. No matter how much money a person has acquired, it is difficult to say they are satisfied with what they have. People who own more than one home have often found it to be more of a burden than a blessing.

People who have become hermits and live on their own have not found happiness, but instead loneliness and a sense that they do not belong. Those who have hoarded furniture and things for their homes to the point that one cannot walk through their homes, have not found happiness in having more stuff than their neighbor. True happiness is not found in having more. True happiness is found in having less of the things that distract us from what is really important in life – our relationship with God and with others.

This season of Lent, I encourage you to take some time out of your busy schedule in life to attend the Wednesday evening Prayer services and see how God has blessed us through our partnership with many ministries that positively impact the lives of people. Traditionally, Ash Wednesday is well attended and then attendance goes down each week

during Lent. I want to challenge you to make the Wednesday Evening Prayer a priority in your faith journey this Lent. May this Holy Season be a time of prayer and fasting from the distractions that keep us from loving God with our whole heart, soul and might, and loving our neighbors as ourselves. Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

# FEBRUARY 2020 COUNCIL MINUTES . . .

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by President, Larry Buettner.

**Devotions were given by Pete Peterson.** 

A motion to approve the minutes of the last Council meeting and the annual congregational meeting was made, seconded, and passed.

Treasurer's Report: Bob Tidmore said he was going to set up the depreciation schedule for the SOTG's fixed assets. Bob also recommended we have an independent audit of the church funds. He has agreed to get several bids on the cost of this audit.

Pastor Jeff gave his report to Council. During the month of December, he has attended "in house" meetings involving AV team, Stewardship campaign, proposed budget meeting, Worship and Music Committee and staff. Also attended the Caloosa Conference meeting and the East Naples Ministerial meeting. The pastoral calls included home/member visits (4), home bound communions (4), potential new member visits (7) and (4) hospital/clinic visits. There is a possibility of having 9 new members joining the church on February 2, 2020. He has been working with the ushers and altar guild regarding some changes that will improve with assisting and the flow of worship.

Women's Bible Study began Friday, January 10<sup>th</sup> with (8) ladies in attendance. This group will meet the second Friday of every month during season at 10 a.m. in the music room. He started a Bible study group on Tuesday, January 14<sup>th</sup> that met at 2:00 p.m., and will continue every Tuesday at 2 p.m. during season.

We had two Christmas Eve worship services, 5 and 7 p.m. Everyone that attended seemed to be pleased with the time and type of service. We began two worship services in January and the attendance has been over 200 each Sunday.

Thank you for your prayers and support as Kelli and I attended the funeral of our brother-in-law, Duane Howeison. Duane was 55 years old and had battled brain cancer for 8 years.

Pete Peterson has volunteered to work with a newly formed committee to update the constitution and bylaws. These changes include, but are not limited to, ordaining Word and Service ministers. The committee will also amend the constitution on the procedure of electing council members.

# Team reports:

<u>Education</u> – Pastor thanked Bonny, Nadine and Lori for doing an outstanding job. The women's Bible study on Friday,1/10/2020, had 8 ladies attend and Pastor Jeff's Bible study,1/14/202, had 14 people in attendance.

**Endowment** - Pete Peterson reported the balance in the Endowment fund is \$133,000.

**Evangelism** - No report

<u>Fellowship</u> - Earnie Keller reported that there were over 100 people that attended the Welcome Back Luncheon and enjoyed the presentation the Thrivent representatives provided.

<u>Local Missions</u>– Paul Hashagen reported that the donated food was delivered to St. Matthews in Immokalee, and that the donation the congregation made to Habitat for Humanity this Christmas season was very much appreciated.

**Parish Relations - No report** 

Property - All Christmas decorations have been removed and stored.

Poinsettias plants have been removed. Fountain has been cleaned, painted and reactivated. Bushes on both sides of the large window in front of the church building have been trimmed. Downed tree limbs in the grove have been removed. Furniture in Hanson Hall has been moved to meet the needs of various events scheduled. All the light bulbs in the sanctuary have been replaced with LED lights.

<u>Stewardship</u> – We have had three weeks of Temple Talks; Sunday, January 26, 2020 will be Pledge Sunday.

Earnie reported on the sign from Boyd's Signs. She will get a quote on the cost of the new sign.

### **New Business:**

Annual meeting will be February 23, 2020 between services.

Pastor Jeff contacted the pastor from Faith Lutheran in Lehigh Acres and was told that there was damage to their cement benches and their speakers during a recent theft. A motion was made to send Faith Lutheran \$1000 to cover some of their replacement expenses.

Council voted on starting a "Seminary Sponsorship Fund" to help students either studying in seminary or attending a Lutheran College.

Barb Keller will provide the devotional reading for the February meeting. Pastor Jeff provided devotions at the end of the meeting. Council was adjourned at 6:45 p.m.


