# **SHEPHERD OF THE GLADES LUTHERAN CHURCH**

**“The people dwelling in darkness have seen a great light, and for those dwelling in the region and shadow of death, on them a light has dawned.” (Matthew 4:16 ESV).**

There are 12 days of Christmas, representing the journey the Magi made to see Christ, the King. Don't put away that tree or take down those lights too quickly! Take in the message of “Rejoice, rejoice, Emmanuel, has come to you oh Israel” and “Joy to the World, the Lord is come, let earth receive her king!” We have been living and dwelling in a darkness for so long. But there is hope and there is a light that the darkness cannot overcome. It is Christ our King. The Gospel of Matthew quoted at the beginning of this letter is also found in the Old Testament book of the prophet Isaiah 9:2.



The birth of Jesus Christ is celebrated during a time of year that the daylight is visible for the least amount of time. We often say these are the shortest days of the year, but when the light is not visible, it feels like these are the longest days of the year and of our life. When the darkness of the shadow of death overwhelms us, we become weary and often feel hopeless. 2020 has been filled with many difficult and long days. But we remember that there is not a darkness that the light of Christ cannot overcome. Celebrations are difficult when we are grieving, but they give us hope and a glimpse of light in our darkest times. Celebrating the birth of Jesus reminds us that even in the darkest hours, new life is born. We have just come out of the time of winter solstice. The darkest days we have experienced are now behind us. So what new life and spark of hope can we look forward to in 2021?

As we look back at 2020, there was much to celebrate, even in the midst of the darkness we experienced because of Covid 19. It is not likely that January 1st will mark the end of the darkness of this horrible disease that has claimed the lives of so many, but there is a glimpse of hope and light in the vaccines that are beginning to roll out. There is also reason to hope for a brighter future as we recognize that 2020 and the closure of the church for public worship forced us to become evangelists and develop an international church through the internet. The Good News that we share can be heard globally, and not just in the building. Because of the darkest times in recent history, the Church has left the building and is reaching out to hundreds who otherwise might not be able to attend worship. And it was in 2020 that Shepherd of the Glades raised over \$22,000 specifically to assist the homeless and hungry. Because of your generosity and refusal to dwell in the darkness, the people walking in the darkness have seen a great light, who is Christ the Savior. And if we can do this together in 2020, what can we do in 2021 that will let our light shine before others so that they may see our good works and glorify God in Heaven? The birth of the Christ child brought us hope. Looking into the eyes of a baby always makes us smile as we see the face of God reflected in their beauty. In the same way, new start ministries bring us joy as we recognize the face of God reflected in the hope these new starts provide. Did you know that we have two new start ELCA ministries in our Conference? Emmanuel Communities in Emmanuel Park is located on Oil Well Road just West of Everglades Blvd. This new community church includes a soccer field, playground, and lake with a walking path. The idea behind this new start ministry is that the church is

more than the building. It is the community. This new ministry already provides a safe place to have fun and food assistance for local residents. In the darkness, God is providing a great light in this new ministry. A second new ministry is Babcock Ranch; again, a community oriented new start. Like all new buildings in Babcock Ranch, this new ministry will be building a church that is completely powered by renewable energy! The light is shining in the darkness in a new way.

But maybe you do not feel called to support new start ministries. There will be plenty of opportunities for you to support the ministry we share at Shepherd of the Glades. A new Capital Campaign will begin in 2021 to bring much needed updates to our facilities including new lights and resurfacing the parking lot. Or maybe your gifts are gifts of service. We always welcome sharing your gift as a greeter/usher, lector, or musical offering for indoor worship. Don't put away those Christmas lights or Christmas spirit too soon. Let your light shine in the darkness so others may see your good works and glorify your father in Heaven. God bless you, and Happy New Year!

# COUNCIL'S CORNER . . .

## SHEPHERD OF THE GLADES LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES November 10, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 5:39 p.m. by President, Larry Buettner.

The meeting of the Shepherd of the Glades Council was held via conference call because of the Corona Virus. Members in attendance: Larry Buettner, Bob Tidmore, Pat Cooper, Pete Peterson, Bonny Dery, and Barb Keller. Pastor Jeff Unga was also in attendance. Paul Hashagen, Charlotte Wahlig, Keith Scamehorn, and Doug Walck were absent.

Devotions were given by Larry Buettner with prayer for our civic leaders.

A motion to approve the minutes of the last Council meeting as written was made, seconded, and passed.

**Pastor's report:** Pastor Jeff reported that he has had "Zoom" meetings with Caloosa Conference, East Naples Ministerial group, personal spiritual direction meetings; meetings with Altar Guild members, staff, ushers, Worship Committee, Nominating Committee, Evangelism Committee regarding the Christmas gift program, and Budget Committee. He has also had AV training with the new equipment and weekly staff meetings. Pastor has been calling, visiting, and praying with members who have been hospitalized or sick or interested in joining the church. He has been doing homebound communions. Pastor is sending weekly readings in advance of worship, and videotaping weekly greeters for Sunday worship. He performed a funeral for an inactive member. He is assembling a Mutual Ministry Team which will be under the direction of the Parish Relations Council member and will form a Memorial Committee next month which will be under the direction of the Treasurer. A 10:30 a.m. service began on 11/8/2020 and will continue through the winter months. Weather permitting, it will be outdoors.

**Treasurer's Report:** Bob Tidmore reported that the giving was below what was budgeted for the month but that our expenses were down from what was budgeted. The Finance Committee met to approve the budget for 2021. Pat Cooper made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report, which was seconded by Larry Buettner and approved by all.

### Committee reports:

Due to the Corona Virus and inactivity of the church, the following Council members gave a report:

**Endowment** - Pete Peterson reported that the balance in our Ameritrade account as of October 31, 2020 is \$128,794.

**Parish Relations** – Barb Keller is now the liaison to the Mutual Ministry Team.

**Education** – Bonny Dery reported that the second batch of calendars were almost all sold with monies to be used for the youth.

**Property** - Doug Walck had submitted a written report. The wooded area was cleaned of fallen branches this past month. He is receiving bids for repaving the parking lot. A bid was also solicited and received for a replacement of the Santa Barbara Blvd sign for \$800. Pastor Jeff purchased a portable sound system to use for outdoor services. The landscape contractor is clearing the front sign of inside bushes and roots. We also have a quote to replace the parking lot lights for \$10,915.89. It was motioned, seconded, and carried in favor to approve the replacing of the parking lot lights and to replace the Santa Barbara Blvd sign.

**Stewardship** – Pete is trying to recruit people for the stewardship talks in January.

**Local Missions** – Paul took food to Saint Matthew's House in Immokalee. They are in need of baby diapers.

**Worship & Music** – Pat reported that Pastor Jeff and Megan were doing a very good job with the music and worship, bringing people in through the internet and in the sanctuary.

## COUNCIL'S CORNER (CONTINUED) . . .

### Old Business:

Bonny Dery is still waiting on Collier County to come up with the plans for the original sign out front. Pastor Jeff met with a doctor who reported that wearing masks should be mandatory indoors with a 6 foot distancing. Outdoor masks are optional but should include 6 foot distancing.

### New Business:

Bob Tidmore reported that there will be a capital campaign to raise money for the parking lot lights, sign, and parking lot repaving. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve sending of the pastor and staff Christmas gift letter. Discussion of dental assistance for Pastor Jeff was tabled until next meeting. AA groups have been meeting on Mondays and have requested two more meetings. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approved to allow the additional meetings. A motion was made, seconded and carried to add a \$50 sanitizing fee to all groups renting Hanson Hall.

Council adjourned at 6:39 p.m. with closing devotions by Pastor Jeff.

Next meeting will be December 8, 2020 with devotions by Doug Walck.


