

PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

By the time most of you read this article, you will have already celebrated Labor Day weekend. Last month, I wrote about some changes that have happened in the last 3 years. Change is inevitable. Sometimes we recognize the changes and other times change is less dramatic. Labor Day weekend used to be a big holiday marking the end of summer vacation. Most of you probably watched or participated in the Jerry Lewis Labor Day telethons that raised millions of dollars every year in an attempt to eradicate muscular dystrophy. The Jerry Lewis MDA telethon began in 1966 and was popular for many years but ended in 2010. Another change you may have noticed is that public school did not start until after Labor Day but in most parts of our country, school now starts before Labor Day. For most of us, these changes were not dramatic. Although we like things to remain the same, changes will happen.



As we start a new school year, I ask for you to pray for students, teachers, and all who work in the school system. There was a time

when we didn't have to even think about the safety and well being of those who go to school, but between the evolution of new viruses and concerns with violence in our schools, it is important for us to pray. We should pray not just for our schools, students and employees of our schools but for children and education systems around the globe. Well educated students provide for a better future for the world as they may develop the cure to cancer, muscular dystrophy, and other diseases that currently exist. Well educated students receive an understanding of the importance of living together in community peaceably with others who have a different perspective. The foundation of a good education is important. There is an American citizen that teaches in Ukraine who I learned of through a friend. She is married to a man from Ukraine and they continue to live in their home in Ukraine. She has been interviewed by American news, and in the interviews she has shared how difficult it is to continue teaching in a war torn country. Some of her students have migrated to other countries but continue their education in Ukraine via the internet. She reports that the school children are living in fear and uncertainty. They want to return to their home and live in peace. For many of her students, she is the anchor and connection to their homeland as she teaches from Ukraine. In the interview, she stated that teachers' lives are at risk in the event the Russian military occupies Ukrainian territory. She has asked for pravers for peace and an end to the violence and destruction that Ukraine is experiencing due to war. So I ask for your prayers, and I give thanks for your support to people who have been affected by this war. You may recall the fund raisers we had for the people of Ukraine. Your financial gifts have been stewarded well to assist those going through traumatic changes in their lives. Thank you for your prayers and financial support.

Your financial gifts of \$39,028 that were sent to Lutheran World Relief have been utilized in the following ways. Within Ukraine, hospitals in Kyiv and Chernihiv are receiving surgical and wound care kits, gauze, IV kits, oxygen masks, defibrillators and stretchers. There are ongoing provisions for 6 emergency bomb shelters that have housed more than 15,000 people. Mental health services are being provided for families and those in need. In Poland where many refugees fled for safety, LWR has provided 2 million dollars in emergency cash for food, medical expenses, transportation and clothing for those displaced due to the war. This funding is also used to help prevent sexual exploitation and abuse of the women who are seeking safe refuge. Essential supplies including milk, energy biscuits, personal hygiene products and more are also being provided for those in need. LWR health kits and quilts from congregations are also being distributed to those in need.

I cannot thank you enough for making Christ known through your generosity and prayer support. You have made a positive impact and let your light shine in very dark places. I know that many of

us long for the days of the Jerry Lewis telethons and peace in our country and throughout the world. But we have much to be grateful for and thankful about. As we put one more Labor Day Holiday behind us, make sure you thank teachers for their work. Pray for their safety and well being. Give God thanks for the many blessings in your life.


