PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

On March 15 our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America presiding bishop, Elizabeth Eaton, published a pastoral letter dealing with hate-filled violence that seems to know no bounds. She was reacting to shootings in two mosques in Christchurch, New Zealand. She had reacted to other acts of violence right here in the United States as they had happened: a Sikh Temple in Oak Creek, a Christian church in Charleston, and a Jewish synagogue in Pittsburgh. In each letter she wondered about the effect these acts of violence has on any people who gather to worship God and express their faith.



Our Founding Fathers crafted a Bill of Rights attached to our Constitution. Their first thought was to defend the right to worship, speak, assemble, and ask for the redress of grievances:

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances. [Article I of the Bill of Rights]

Bishop Eaton wonders whether Muslim people throughout the world might be fearful to go to worship. Her question of wonder would apply to Sikhs, Jews, even Christians as they wish to gather, based on attacks and deaths in their houses of worship.

I wonder what might be happening in our country and throughout the world these days. Right here in Naples we may feel very safe to come to church. Attacks seem to be like random acts. But religious leaders, like Bishop Eaton and many others, believe that a pattern of hate-filled violence is occurring. And the more violence happens, and the more hardened we become to hearing about it, the more emboldened are those who would be violent. Worse than that, I hear conversations about people of color, or people whose religious practices are different from ours, or people who come to our nation from other lands – just to mention a few ways we isolate those different from us. The more people talk, the more their language seems to poison the way they feel about and the judgments they make about the worth of these “others.”

You might remember that I preached about my own “inner dialogue” and how salty and demeaning it frequently was. I have changed my thought patterns by prefacing my mental remarks about drivers in Florida with: “Child of God ...” Having changed my language and my thoughts that make up my inner dialogue, I use less salty and demeaning words in my mind, and therefore less when my inner dialogue slips out of my mouth. Of course, this is a work in progress. But I have changed.

PASTOR'S PAGES (Continued). . .

What makes any human being different from us? Are we not all children of God? Should we remind those who speak and act as if others are not children of God, that those others are indeed as much God's children as any one of us? Should we call out anyone who speaks that way in public and remind them that we are all God's children, with no exceptions? Indeed that takes courage and commitment to our values as moral, religious people. A modest beginning: change the way we think and talk. The actions will follow. We have the Holy Spirit to guide us and help us along the way.

LENT & EASTER 2019 . . .

Each week provides a pair of complimentary readings from sacred Scripture as the center point for reflection. These readings explore different dimensions of God’s love for us and the love of Christ we share. The schedule for the remainder of Lent is as follows:

Evening celebration of Maundy Thursday, April 18 and Good Friday, April 19, both at 5:30 p.m. There will be a Prayer Vigil during the day on Good Friday from 8:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. A sign-up sheet will be available in the Narthex.

Easter Sunday - Joyous Easter celebrations at both 8:30 and 10:30 a.m.

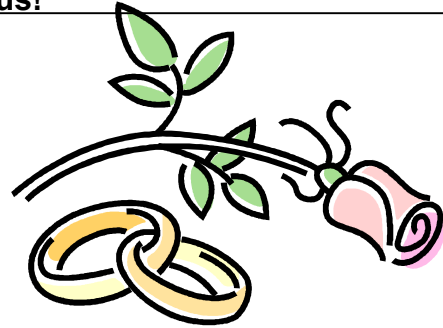

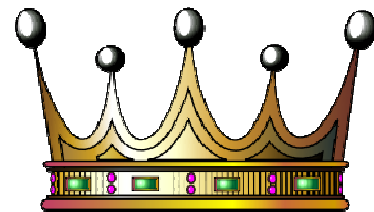

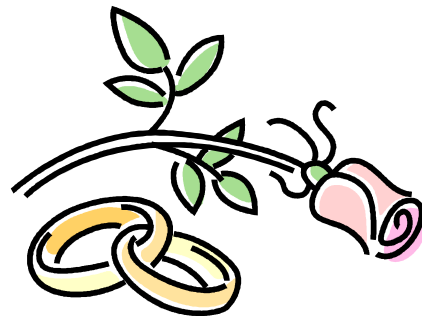

SHEPHERD OF THE GLADES LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES March 12, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 5:28 p.m. by President, Larry Buettner. Members in attendance: Larry Buettner, Pat Cooper, Pat Cumor, Tom Dunlop, Paul Hashagen, Earnie Keller, Pete Peterson, Keith Scamehorn, Doug Walck, and Tony Zeman. Pastor Bob Hoffman was also in attendance.

Devotions were given by Larry Buettner from Luther's prayer for guidance. A motion to approve the minutes of the last Council meeting was voiced by Tom Dunlop, seconded by Doug Walck, and passed. A motion was made by Tom Dunlop, seconded by Paul Hashagen, and approved to accept the annual meeting minutes.

Pastor's report: Pastor Bob reported that he had officiated a memorial service for Hank Harvey. Esther Dressler is now in hospice at Physician's Regional on Collier Blvd. Barbara Modjeska is still in the hospital. The Ministry Site Profile has been approved by the Synod.

Team reports:

Finance - Tony Zeman reported that checking and savings accounts are \$6,000 over January's figures. The Endowment Fund is up \$3,150 over January. Attendance is down 26% from February, 2018. Offerings are down 31% from budgeted and 28% lower than February, 2018. Administrative postage expenses are higher than projected due to mail, postage meter postage and lease expenses all hitting in February. Music and worship have a new expense category for Audio Visual salary. We are not sure what the total cost will be for 2019 and need to keep an eye on this item. In other income, investment income was up \$2,413 for the month and \$8,979 for the year to date, recovering from a investment loss the end of 2018.

Parish Relations - No report

Endowment - Pete Peterson reported that the Endowment Fund value is up \$1,129 to \$113,512.

Property - Doug Walck reported that the Property Committee has been trying to catch up on outdoor landscaping projects like trimming bushes and laying down mulch. Due to the increased indoor activity, the committee has to spend more time setting up and organizing furniture in Hanson and sanctuary. This definitely cuts into outdoor time for landscaping repairs and family time. Committee needs more help. If we can get more help, Doug proposes that we divide the committee into two categories; one for landscaping and general repairs; and one for set-up of indoor activities. Most of the committee are getting older and have physical limitations. The hand tools in the garage have been inspected and some need to be replaced. A motion was made by Larry Buettner and seconded by Tom Dunlop to spend \$200 for replacement tools in the shed. Hanson Hall air conditioners were discussed. They will be watched over the summer to ascertain if it is more cost effective to replace or fix older air conditioners. We will need to increase reserves for them.

Stewardship - Tom Dunlop was concerned with the number of boxed envelopes still in the Narthex and not picked up.

Fellowship - Earnestine Keller reported that this Sunday will be Quilt Sunday. Quilts on display will be available for sale at \$25 each. Ninety one quilts have already been sent to needy organizations. The Sew-Sew's make between 175-200 quilts per year.

COUNCIL'S CORNER (Continued) . .

Local Missions– Paul Hashagen reported that they will be taking the food on the cart either Sunday or Wednesday to St. Matthew’s.

Education - Larry Buettner reported that Thursday night will be Family Movie Night. Doug Walck reported that the sign had been updated to advertise this.

Evangelism/Publicity - Pat Cumor reported that she is looking into placing an ad in the paper for Easter, letting people know that we will be having an Easter Egg Hunt between services on Easter. There will not be an Easter sunrise service at 7 a.m. this year.

Worship & Music - Larry Buettner reported that the Lord’s Prayer will go back to the way we used to sing it.

Old Business:

Call Committee - Larry Buettner reported that the MSP had been posted and things are moving forward, but may still take some time.

Synod Assembly Delegates - We need to find two delegates to go to Synod Assembly on June 6-8 because registration will be open soon.

New Business:

New Member Sunday - Pastor Bob reported that we may have two people who are interested in becoming members. New Member Sunday will be either March 31 or April 7.

February Annual Meeting - Perhaps we should dispense with an annual meeting each February.

Concern about absence of long time members - Pete Peterson voiced concern about several long time members who have not been attending. He thinks we should reach out to these members to find out why they have been absent. A committee to call on these people would be nice.

Altar Guild - Pete Peterson thought that the Altar Guild should be separate from the Worship & Music committee. He thought we needed some organization and monthly protocol for what the Altar Guild does.

Audio-Visual - We should have someone internally who can operate the audio –visual equipment for church services.

Return to one Sunday service - One Sunday service will begin on May 5.

The next Council meeting will be held on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 at 5:30 p.m. A motion to adjourn was made by Doug Walck and seconded by Pete Peterson and adjourned at 6:41 p.m.

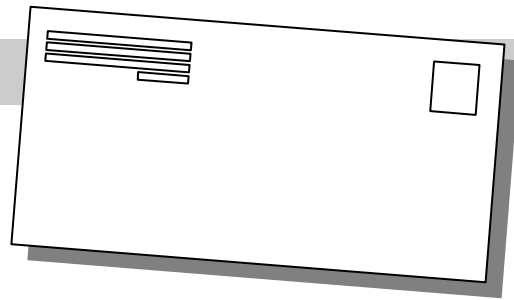

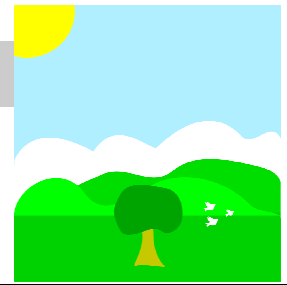
