PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

A very blessed Advent and Merry Christmas to all. As we look ahead to the days of this upcoming Holy Holiday season we do so by faith. 2 Corinthians 5:7 says we walk by faith, and not by sight. This Holy Holiday, we remember that it was by faith that Mary accepted the invitation of the angels for her to conceive and give birth to Immanuel - God with us. It was by faith that Joseph accepted and believed the angel's description of the immaculate conception of the child that was in Mary's womb. It was by faith that the Magi followed the star to the place where Jesus was born, trusting they would see the newborn king promised of old. And it is by faith that we gather on Christmas Eve and every Sunday to celebrate new life in Jesus Christ, trusting that God is truly with us.



The stewardship campaign theme for 2022 will be "By faith." Stewardship is about more than making a financial pledge to the church. It is about caring for and using the gifts that God has given to us. Church members are stewards of the ministry of baptizing and making disciples of Jesus. Because we have been so limited for the past two years to fully participate in worship and outreach, we now have the opportunity to start fresh with new volunteers to serve on the various committees and perhaps even do some things different than before the pandemic. It is by faith the Stewardship Committee is offering this ministry fair with the hope that the various committees will have many people willing to serve the church and steward their gifts of time and talent.

This year's annual meeting will be held on Sunday, December 12th. There will be five newly elected members of the congregation who will agree to serve the Church Council. They will accept this invitation to leadership by faith. It is important that you come to the annual meeting to support and to pray for those who are willing to have their names presented as nominees for the Church Council. It is also very important that you attend the annual meeting this year because the Finance Committee and the Council are proposing a budget that is being presented by faith. As we continue to grow as a congregation both in age and in number, our pastoral needs and ministry expenses also increase. The Council spent a great deal of time and energy looking at and debating this faith based budget proposal and by faith voted to adopt it to present it to the congregation at the annual meeting.

I am excited about the growth we are experiencing, and I am excited that we have faith filled leaders who have taken the time to seriously consider what God is inviting us to do as we live out our faith at Shepherd of the Glades. CHRISTMAS MISSIONS . . .

COUNCIL CORNER . . .

November 9, 2021 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Bonny Dery, President.

The meeting of the Shepherd of the Glades Council was held in person and via conference call because of the Corona Virus. Members in attendance: Bonnie Brisky, Brenda Charleston, Pat Cooper, Bonny Dery, Paul Hashagen, Bob Tidmore, Barb Keller, Charlotte Wahlig, Doug Walck, and Phil Willman. Pastor Unga was also in attendance.

Penny Morken was absent

Devotions: Bob Tidmore

A motion to approve the minutes of the last Council meeting as written was made, seconded, and passed.

Pastor's report: Pastor Jeff reported that he has had ZOOM meetings with East Naples Ministerial group, personal spiritual direction meetings, and Caloosa Conference. He has attended weekly staff meetings and met with the Property Committee re: sanctuary lighting bids; fire detection alarm system; budget, evangelism and nominating committees. Pastor has met with the Pastors of both the Spanish and Haitian churches. He has been visiting and praying with members that have been hospitalized or sick, and he has been doing homebound communions.

Memorial service for Carol Lyberg was well attended and the Lyberg family was very pleased with the service and would like to thank everyone who worked at the luncheon to make it such a success.

Synod Assembly was online October 15-16th. Ann and Paul Hashagen attended the assembly with Pastor and they felt it was very informative and worthwhile. Hanson Hall continues to be utilized by Iglesia Conexión United Methodist Church, Haitian Baptist Church, Bone Builders, AA Groups, HOA neighborhood groups and our Sew-Sews.

We continue to follow CDC guidelines and are monitoring local Covid cases. Masks continue to be recommended during worship. Communion is now being offered by intinction at the communion railing.

The nominating committee submitted a list of names to Council regarding the 2022 nominees.

Pastor appreciates the time off that allowed him and his family to attend his brother's funeral.

Treasurer's Report: Bob Tidmore stated that the Truist account showed an increase for the month of October. Bob presented Council with a 2022 proposed budget. After much discussion, Council voted to accept the budget and to present the proposed budget to the congregation at the December 12th annual meeting.

COUNCIL CORNER (Continued) . . .

Both the Pastor's and Treasurer's reports were motioned for approval, seconded, and passed.

Committee reports:

Endowment – Balance in Ministry Growth Fund shows a decrease as of September 30, 2021.

Parish Relations – Mutual Ministry Team did not meet in October.

Property - Doug Walck reported that the equipment needed for the lighting modules & the new electrical beam in the Sanctuary is still on backorder. The Company hired to replace the fire safety beam in the Sanctuary is waiting for approval of the required permits. Property volunteers replaced the GFI on the memorial fountain, and continue to clean out the debris in the grove caused by windstorms.

Education – Pastor Unga is providing a Bible study class every Thursday at 3:00 p.m. Elaine Sima is providing a women's bible study the second Friday of every month beginning at 10:00 a.m.

Fellowship – Trunk or Treat was a great success. We had over 200 children and parents visit our parking lot.

Stewardship – Committee met and discussed the correspondence letter for next year.

Evangelism-Bonnie Brisky reported that we have six people that will be joining the church on Sunday, November 21st. The recipient of the "giving tree" this year will be the children that attend the Iglesia Conexion United Methodist Church. One third of the tickets for the Paul Todd concert have been sold. The committee will now advertise to the general public to sell the remainder of the tickets. Council agreed to work with Lutheran Social Services to provide an uncooked Christmas dinner (ham and all the trimmings) to families in our area that are in need.

Local Mission-Food was blessed and taken to St. Matthew's Friendship House in Immokalee.

Worship & Music – Pastor met with the committee to discuss the possibility of providing new music opportunities through December. Outdoor services were discussed for January when we go to two services.

New Business:

Annual meeting is scheduled for Sunday, December 12, 2021, immediately following the worship service.

Property will get bids on replacing 10 light fixtures in Hanson Hall.

Council was adjourned at 7:15 p.m. with closing prayer by Pastor Jeff.

Next meeting will be December 14, 2021, at 6:00 p.m., with devotions by Doug Walck.
