“Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good. His steadfast love endures forever.” (Psalm 136:1) As we approach Thanksgiving, it is appropriate that we view this holiday not as a springboard to Christmas, but rather a time to reflect on the many blessings God has given us. Hurricane Ian took the lives of at least 114 Florida residents and left behind damages estimated from 41 - 70 billion dollars in damage to property and agricultural loss. That is a staggering number that is almost unbelievable. Some might ask, “Where is your God in this mess and destruction?” The answer is evident if you are willing to look. The first Sunday after the hurricane, I played news footage of people of faith who looked beyond their own needs and saved the lives of others. From the teens who used their canoes to seek people trapped in their homes to the emergency first responders who risked their lives to save others, God was present. Immediately after the hurricane, people opened up their homes to those displaced by the hurricane. Complete strangers became good friends. There are so many stories of people who are heroes of the faith who reached out to help others in their time of need. The Florida Bahamas Synod disaster relief ministry gave out over \$50,000 within two weeks of the hurricane to people who were identified by local ELCA congregations who were in need of immediate assistance. And God was with those who perished in the storm. God’s steadfast love endures forever, even as we face the valley of the shadow of death. We do not minimize the pain and grief some are suffering as their loved ones have perished in this storm. Yet we remember that even death has no power over us when we believe and trust in the promises of God. And so we are invited to give thanks to the Lord and see the many ways that God is good. In case you have not heard yet, the only known damage to the church property is the roof on Hanson Hall. This will be expensive to fix, but it could have been so much worse. And so we give thanks to the Lord for the blessings God has provided.



As we end a busy October and enter into November, the church is hopping with new life and many activities. Thank you to all who brought clothing for Undy Sunday. We filled the boxes to the brim! With our collaboration with Catholic Charities, many families will be grateful for your donations and give thanks to the Lord for your generosity. These are financially challenging times for families. Also, thank you to all who helped by bringing candy to distribute for Halloween night and to those who decorated their cars and distributed candy. We enjoyed Trunk or Treat and meeting our neighbors and their children in a fun way. The fun and excitement of October has ended, but November is equally as busy! November 13th we will be honoring Veterans day weekend with a reception following worship. We will also be receiving and welcoming many new members to Shepherd of the Glades on November 13th! Please come and celebrate with us!

On Thursday November 24th, we will host a Thanksgiving meal for anyone who might otherwise be eating alone or be without family on Thanksgiving. Please be sure to sign up for this event if you plan on attending so that we can prepare enough food for

October 11, 2022, COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Bonny Dery, President.

Members in attendance: Bob Tidmore, Penny Morken, Bonnie Brisky, Brenda Charleston, Bonny Dery, Doug Walck, Charlotte Wahlig, Brad Caulder, John Sherman, and Pastor Unga.

Absent: Elaine Sima and Barbara Keller

Devotions: Brenda Charleston

A motion to approve the minutes of the September Council meeting was made, seconded, and approved as written.

Pastor's report: Pastor Jeff continues to make congregation home visits, provides home bound communions, and makes hospital visits. Pastor Jeff reported that he had a meeting with Spiritual Advisory board of AVOW Hospice and attended weekly staff meetings. Pastor has regular communication with Pastor Orlando Ramirez of Iglesia Conexion and Pastor DJ and Haitian Baptist Church leaders, and the Caloosa Conference. Hanson Hall continues to be utilized by Iglesia Conexion United Methodist Church, Haitian Baptist Church, Bone Builders, AA Group, HOA neighborhood groups. Pastor Ramirez has requested permission to install two large screen televisions so they can project the words to the music they sing.

The new chimes arrived and sound beautiful.

Nominating committee will present names for 2023 council at the November meeting. Annual meeting date is scheduled for Sunday, December 11, 2022, following the worship service.

A new AA group has requested the use of Hanson Hall for an evening meeting. The motion was made, seconded, and approved by council.

Lutheran World Relief will have a representative come to Shepherd of the Glades worship on November 6th to thank us for our gift and explain how these gifts were used.

There are many resources and financial assistance programs for persons in need. The ELCA disaster response has set up their website for donors and have been very efficient at checking in on local pastors and ministries. The Synod disaster response has also been very helpful in their response (including immediate financial assistance for someone in our congregation and offers for pastor care).

Treasurer's Report: Bob Tidmore reported, that the Truist investment account shows a decrease as of the end of September 2022. This account has been fluctuating along with the stock market. Our giving is about even with our budget, and our expenses have increased substantially due to the cost of the unexpected a/c repairs that have been made. Bob stated that he will meet with the chairman of the various church committees to discuss their needs for the 2023 budget. The finance committee will present a proposed 2023 budget to the council at the November meeting.

Both the Pastor's and Treasurer's reports were motioned for approval, seconded, and passed.

Committee reports:

Endowment – Charlotte Wahlig reported that our investment balance was down as of August 31, 2022. This reflects the status of the stock market. An endowment meeting will be scheduled later in October.

Parish Relations – Hanson Hall rental policy committee met August 16th to discuss rental of Hanson Hall. The purpose of the meeting was to gather information and questions about what should be included in the policy. Brad Caulder (committee chairman), agreed to do a review of our insurance policy regarding coverage for rental of Hanson Hall and set up a committee meeting to make any necessary changes to the policy.

Property – The Property Committee would like to thank all the members of the congregation that helped with the property clean-up. Another clean-up of the grove behind the church will be

scheduled soon.

Education – Weekly 10 a.m. Wednesday Bible study is going well and has 7-9 people attending. The Women’s Bible Study is scheduled to begin on Friday, November 11, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.

Fellowship – The first fellowship activity will be “Trunk or Treat” on October 31, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in the church parking lot. On November 13, 2022, they will provide a veterans’ reception.

Stewardship – No Report

Evangelism- New Member Sunday is scheduled for Sunday, November 13, 2022. The committee is planning to serve a “traditional” Thanksgiving meal to any member of the congregation that would like to attend. An announcement will be made each Sunday, and flyers will be available in the narthex along with a sign-up sheet for those wanting to attend. The “giving tree” will benefit the residents at ProMedica this year.

Local Mission- Donated food was delivered to St. Matthews House in Naples.

Worship & Music – John Sherman is making plans for another entertaining concert to benefit the victims of Hurricane Ian. The date and time are still being discussed.

Council meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m. with closing prayer by Pastor Jeff.

Next meeting will be November 8,2022, at 6:00 p.m., with devotions by Bob Tidmore.
