SHEPHERD OF THE GLADES LUTHERAN CHURCH DECEMBER 12, 2023, COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Council President, Bonny Dery at 6:00 p.m.
Members in attendance: Pastor Ungs, Bob Tidmore, Penny Morken, Doug Walck, Charlotte Wahlig, Bonnie Brisky, John Sherman, Bonny Dery, and Brenda Charleston
Absent: Brad Caulder, Ed Ries, and Elaine Sima. Devotions: Doug Walck

A motion to approve the minutes of the November 14, 2023, Council meeting was made, seconded, and approved as written.

Pastor's report:

Pastor Jeff continues to make congregation home visits/member visits, home bound communions, and hospital/clinic/rehab visits. Pastor Jeff reported that he had meetings with Spiritual Advisory Board of AVOW Hospice, New Member Luncheon, East Naples Ministerium, Grief Support group, photo directory meeting, Stewardship meeting, Nominating Committee, and weekly staff. Pastor continues to have regular communication with Pastor Orlando Ramirez of Iglesia Conexion and Pastor DJ and Haitian Baptist Church leaders, and the Caloosa Conference. Hanson Hall continues to be utilized by Iglesia Conexion United Methodist Church, Bone Builders, AA Groups, and HOA neighborhood groups. New Council members (Pam Bhatena, Colleen Hoffman, Becky McDanel, and Gunar Strungs) will be installed on Sunday, January 7, 2024.

Treasurer's Report: Bob Tidmore reported that our investment account was up as of the end of November. November income showed an increase, and the year to date shows income was higher than expenses. The 2024 proposed budget was approved by the congregation at the annual meeting on December 10, 2023.

Both the Pastor's and Treasurer's reports were motioned for approval, seconded, and passed.

Committee reports:

Endowment – Endowment Fund showed a decrease as of October 31, 2023.

Parish Relations – No report

Property – Council voted to have G & C landscaping remove bushes from the front of the building. Poole Roofing is scheduled to repair damage to the roof in Hanson Hall in January 2024.

Education – Pastor Jeff's weekly 10 a.m. Wednesday Bible study continues to be well attended. Online class is available upon request.

Fellowship – The Fellowship Committee had a very successful bake sale. They raised over \$900.00 to help offset the cost of our 50th Anniversary celebration. They are looking forward to the first "Christmas Open House" on Saturday, December 16th.

Stewardship – Pastor Jeff, Brad Caulder, and Chuck Keller will meet this month to discuss the 2024 Stewardship campaign.

Evangelism – The Evangelism Committee reported that all the little backpacks were taken off the Giving Tree! We will be filling the backpacks some time in the month of March. Thank you to everyone that participated!

Local Mission - Food continues to be distributed to St. Matthews House in Naples and Friendship House in Immokalee. The quilting Sew-Sews donated 8 quilts to Grace Place.

Worship & Music – John Sherman has scheduled a “Reunion Concert” on February 10, 2024. He will perform with his friend and fellow entertainer, Marco Gueli.

John is looking for volunteers to help with advertising & selling tickets.

The Worship & Music Committee is looking for volunteers that can play an instrument, love to sing, and would like to perform for the congregation.

New Business:

The Thanksgiving Meal was a wonderful success. It was well attended, and everyone got to take leftovers home. Thank you to everyone that helped with the decorating and food preparation!

The Paul Todd & Friends Concert, held Monday, December 4th was a delight to everyone that attended. Paul donated \$1,000 of the proceeds to help offset the cost of our 50th anniversary celebration.

Council voted to approve the hiring of a part-time assistant for Pastor Ungs during season. This person will help Pastor with the in-home visits, taking communion to shut-ins, and provide services on Sunday mornings.

Old Business:

Pastor Jeff, Penny Morken, and the office staff met with a representative from Universal Church Directories to discuss having a new pictorial directory made by for the 50th Anniversary. Appointments are being scheduled for church photos that will be taken on January 9, 10, and 11, 2024.

Plans are continuing to be made regarding the celebration of the 50th anniversary of Shepherd of the Glades, which will be held Sunday, March 10, 2024. The planning committee is forming a steering committee that is selecting catered food and has met with the Fellowship Committee for decorating ideas. The “Beautification Project” for improving the look of the grounds, is also helping.

MAKING THE MOST OF THE NEW YEAR . . .

Here's 12 Christian New Year resolutions to help you make the most of 2024!

1. Gain God's Vision – Set Goals For The New Year The new year is one of our favorite times of the year. It's a chance to bring all our hopes, dreams and challenges before the Lord and seek His guidance and input. But doing so doesn't do any good unless we give Him the chance to respond and guide us in the right direction in order to fulfill His will. That's why we must not only set aside a quiet time to come before God with your Bible, a notebook and pen – we must also take the time to listen. Setting goals for the new year, as Christians, means setting them WITH God, not just for His name sake. Ask God what He wants you to focus on in this new year. Let God guide you as you make plans and set goals for the new year. Inviting God into our new year resolutions shows Him that we are willing and ready to be His disciples, being guided by His Spirit. Ask God to help your eyes, ears and heart to be open this new year in order to hear His word and feel Him moving you in a certain direction.

2. Find A Bible Reading Plan Now that you've set goals for the new year, you're going to need God's wisdom, [strength and courage](#) to see it through! If you've been struggling to read your Bible, the new year offers a chance to reset and find a [Bible reading plan](#) that works with your lifestyle and give you some spiritual discipline. Choose an online Bible app or download an audio Bible you can listen to in the car as you run errands, on the way to work, while on a walk on the treadmill or as you make supper. God's word is there for us not only to read His story but to strengthen us and give us hope and courage throughout the days of our lives. Reading the Bible daily is a good practice to make sure you always keep God's will and grace in the forefront of your mind. God's wisdom will bear good fruit in your life all year long.

3. Do Healthy Things You probably knew this one was coming! Most of us could eat healthier, but instead of feeling like you need to diet or exercise more, consider making an exchange. This for that. A burger on the grill instead of fast food. A walk around the block to re-energize instead of another cup of coffee. Think about options and start replacing unhealthy choices with healthier ones. Consider creative ways to increase what God gives you: sign up with a dog service and walk a dog every day. Take old wooden pallets and turn them into DIY headboards to sell, or maybe you have some other artistic talent you can capitalize on. Ask around your neighborhood if anyone needs a babysitter or house sitter. Review your finances from the last year and try to find ways to cut some unnecessary expenses. Maybe you only buy a coffee two days of the week instead of four. Or you bring your lunch to work more days this year than last year. Simple and easy switches or cutbacks can end up amounting to a lot of savings over time!

5. Listen More

We mentioned taking time to listen more to God, but what about our family, friends and community God gave us for our journey? It's also important to take the time to listen better to your spouse or your friend who's been texting you that you know you need to get back to. We're also here to be like Jesus to others, and Jesus is the best listener of all. When you're with your loved ones stop what you're doing and really listen to their heart. Get down on your child's level and look into their eyes as they speak. Sit down with your family for a meal . Make eye contact. Relax. Listen. Stay present when you're with others and see just how much stronger it makes your relationships. Speaking of ...

6. Build Meaningful Relationships

As you develop better listening skills, take your relationships offline this year. Make a phone call, schedule a face-to-face coffee, take a walk together. Tell your friends about the goals you've set for the year and ask them to become your accountability partner! Choose a family friend you have always wanted to build a deeper relationship with and tell them that you want to spend more time with them in the new year. This is one of the best New Year resolutions you can make! Counteract the loneliness that's increasingly prevalent in our society with real interaction. Honor God by loving your neighbor and making meaningful connections everywhere you can. Make 2024 a year of building closer relationships with the people God has put in your life.

7. Expand Your Horizons

Break out of your normal routine and expand your horizons this year! Take a class, learn a new skill, explore your city, serve your community by volunteering at a non-profit. Find a way to broaden your perspectives with new experiences and new people. This helps us to learn more about the big wide world that God created. We're able to appreciate other people's talents and skillsets when we try to learn new hobbies or activities. Expanding our own horizons helps us appreciate the diversity God created throughout humankind.

8. Memorize Scripture

Rather than rote memorization of scripture, choose the verses that pop out at you in your Bible reading. Take those scriptures and apply them to your life for real transformation. For example, consider our scripture above, "You crown the year with your bounty." Memorize this [Bible verse](#) by turning it into a prayerful declaration. 11. Be Open To New Ideas

The [Bible](#) says, "The heart of the discerning acquires knowledge, for the ears of the wise seek it out." (Proverbs 18:15 NIV) Another version reads, "Intelligent people are always open to new ideas. In fact, they look for them." Your new year doesn't have to be the same as last year. Break the mold and consider a new way of doing things – especially if something's not working. If you feel stuck or frustrated, seek God for a better way.

12. Develop A Heart Of Worship

Too often we reserve worship for Sunday morning, but God's presence can calm every storm! Establish God's peace in your home and the pressures will lift off, the stress fade away. Turn on Christian praise music or choose a faith-centered [TV show or movie to watch](#). Choose activities that will lift Christ up in your life and God's peace will drive out the anxiety. 2024 holds so much promise and opportunity! As you prayerfully make your new year resolutions, keep Jesus at the center of your planning.
