

PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

"Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares" (Hebrews 13:2 ESV)

Recently, I was driving to the hospital to call on a member and I stopped at a gas station to fill up. A man sitting outside the store saw my cross and commented on how nice it looked. He asked if he could take a closer look at it. The cross I was wearing was a gift to me from a woman who purchased the cross from a missionary. It is made with nails but the loop in the center makes it look somewhat like a crucifix from the distance. I took the cross off and asked the man if he wanted to hold it. He took it into his hands with great reverence and shared with me that he was a new Christian, and he hadn't seen a cross anything like it before.



He asked me if I went to church anywhere, and I told him about Shepherd of the Glades and where the church is located. He thanked me for letting him see the cross and then asked me if I had a couple of bucks to help him out. He needed a taxi ride and didn't have enough money to pay for an Uber. I told him that I do not carry cash, only cards so I couldn't help him by giving him cash, but I asked where he was going and told him I would give him a ride. This man was mostly clean but smelly and he had a prosthetic leg. He had a backpack with his clothes next to him and his bible opened nearby on the sidewalk. I asked his name and he smiled and told me it was Matt. He thanked me for the offer to give him a ride as he struggled to stand up with just one good leg. What followed as we journeyed together to his destination was a God appointment for me.

Matt shared that he was a recovering "meth head." He had been addicted to meth for years but he had been clean for 3 months. He said he tried many times before to stop his addiction but was unsuccessful until his new found faith in Jesus gave him the strength to resist drugs. He told me about his church and where it was located. He told me that church was at 10:30 on Sunday and I should visit sometime. He didn't know I am ordained and serve a church. He said that Jesus gives him all he needs and that he likes to help others when he can. He explained that he had a "buddy" that let him panhandle where he was asked to be dropped off. Matt said he makes between \$50 - \$70 a day. Then he said that he uses the money to help another homeless man by buying him one meal a day from a local fast food place. Matt told me about others he helps who, he said, are less fortunate than him. But he said, "I don't just buy stuff for them without asking them to do something for me, like help me stand up or some other small task. That way it gives them dignity. It's not a hand out. It's a hands up." He also told me that God has provided everything he needs, so he feels good sharing what he has with others. We arrived at Matt's destination, and he thanked me and even offered to give me his last \$5.00 to help pay for gas. I told him to use it to help others, and we parted ways. I returned to traveling to my original destination with many

thoughts and questions. Meeting Matt was like encountering an angel. But can an angel be a homeless, smelly, man with a prosthetic leg? Yes. Angels don't always appear with wings. The word angel means messenger of God. And Matt was a messenger of God for me that day.

My encounter with an angel that day left me wondering how many times in a day I pass by someone in need because I am busy or have somewhere I am going? What if they are messengers of God? How can a man that literally has nothing give away what he has to others because he believes they are less fortunate than him? Do I believe the money and things I have are gifts of God meant to be shared, or do I hoard them as private treasure? This homeless man invited me to his church and told me about the power of faith in Jesus. Why is it so hard for Christians to tell others about our experience of the power of prayer and God in our life and invite them to church?

I am thankful for my encounter with this stranger. His non-judgmental love and care for others and his testimony of faith reminded me that this world is filled with messengers of God. But they may come in very unexpected ways. Be well dear children of God and know that you are loved.

SHEPHERD OF THE GLADES LUTHERAN CHURCH APRIL 9, 2024, COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES (Unoffical)

The meeting was called to order by Council President, Bonny Dery at 6:00 p.m.

Members in attendance: Pastor Ungs, Bob Tidmore, Doug Walck, Charlotte Wahlig, Bonny Dery, Pam Bhathena, Gunar Strungs, Penny Morken, and Colleen Hoffman.

Absent: Becky McDanel and Brad Caulder

Devotions: Penny Morken

A motion to approve the minutes of March 12, 2024, Council meeting was made, seconded, and approved as written.

Pastor's Report- Meetings: East Naples Ministerial lunch meeting, Avow Hospice Spiritual Board, New member luncheon and welcome, Weekly Staff meetings: Property committee, Regular communication with Pastor Orlando Camerez of Iglesia Conexion, Pastor DJ and Haitian Baptist Church leaders and Caloosa Conference. Bible Studies-Eight people attend the weekly 10am Wednesday bible study, but attendance is expected to go down. The bible study will continue to be available online. The bible study that Marcia Schacht is leading will be concluding this month and resume in the Fall. Worship-March average attendance was the highest it has been since 2019. Easter Sunday in person attendance was 406. There were also 92 people who watched online Easter Sunday. He thanked John Sherman for the creation of the newly formed folk group. Thank you to Megan Cianflone for her work getting additional musicians to participate in our Worship. The seasonal member prayer of Godspeed during Worship and brunch went very well. Thank you to the fellowship committee for their hard work all season, but especially for this event. The food was delicious and the fellowship divine. It is Pastor Jeff's hope and intention to have altar assistants (assisting minister) very soon. He will train anyone interested in helping with the liturgy, the prayers, and assisting with communion. He will also work with Linda on training ushers, Jan with getting more readers, and Donia to recruit more people to assist with the altar guild. He would like to see more members participating in Worship leadership, including people trained to do the A/V system.

New Pastoral Business-Pastor Bob covered most of the home bound visitations during March, Pastor Jeff made Hospital/Hospice/clinic rehab visits. Pastor Jeff will be taking some time off during weekdays at the end of April. His #2 granddaughter arrives in early June. He will take a week off then and for the week of her Baptism, scheduled for July 28th. During May 30th – June 2nd Pastor will attend the Synod assembly. Volunteers are needed to fill in for the office during our staff retreat from August 19-23rd to answer the phones and pass along any emergencies that may need attention.

<u>Old Business</u>-New member Sunday was April 7th. We received seven new members! Most of them plan to be very active in the church and participate in committees. A reminder that the First Communion celebration for Kellen Snover is now scheduled for May 26th.

<u>Treasurer's Report-</u> Bob Tidmore reported our Truist Investment account increased during the month of March. Our March income was more than budgeted, and our year-to-date income was more than our year-to-date expenses. Bob noted that our insurance will be due in June.

Both the Pastor's and Treasurer's reports were motioned for approval, seconded, and passed.

Committee Reports:

<u>Parish Relations:</u> Penny announced there has been a good attendance at worship services and fellowship events.

<u>Endowment:</u> Charlotte explained the Endowment Fund showed an increase as of the end of February and pointed out the fund is still growing. <u>Property:</u> Doug thanked Lynn Dickerman for an excellent job putting together a vendor list which was distributed to Council Members. Doug explained Hanson Hall's carpet needs cleaning. A new rod has been purchased to hold the 50th Anniversary banner.

<u>Fellowship:</u> Penny reported 80 people attended the See-You-Again Brunch. The Fellowship committee has had a very busy year with good responses.

<u>Education:</u> Bonny noted it is a great joy when all 3 children attend Sunday School during Worship.

Evangelism: Happily, we received seven new members.

<u>Social Concerns:</u> The food cart on Easter was overflowing and distributed to St. Mathew's House, thanks to all. Quilts from Sew-Sews will be dedicated in April.

<u>Worship and Music:</u> John announced the Folk Group was very excited about the formation of this group. Many compliments were received. Colleen will look for additional people interested in joining the group.

<u>New Business:</u> Discussion on worship and music enhancement for our Worship services. All suggestions for additional musicians/vocalists should be discussed with our director of music, Megan Cianflone.

<u>Old Business:</u> Penny gave a final report of all the expenses for the 50th Anniversary. All expenses have been submitted and paid. The Grace Place Backpack Program was our outreach to the community and had an outstanding response. An announcement to the congregation will be given for a cash donation to help fill the 81 donated backpacks.

<u>Updates:</u> Pastor requested a few items be changed in the new congregational directory. Once these changes are made the directory should be completed by mid-May. Reminder: Resealing of parking lot and markings will begin May 6, 2024.

We greatly overestimated budgetary income for April, resulting in a big shortfall in income. However, we almost broke even for the year to date. In May/June we have a couple of large expenses coming: the parking lot sealing and annual insurance.




<u>Larry & Bev Spees</u> joined SOTG as associate members by affirmation of faith.
