

PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

In one of the Florida Bahamas Synod Conferences on Ministry for rostered ministers, the speaker shared a quote from Ronald Heifetz and Marty Linsky about leadership. The quote said, "Leadership is disappointing your own people at a rate they can absorb." Initially, you might wonder why a leader would disappoint their "own people." Think of it this way. A leader is not a leader but rather a follower when they only follow what the people want and expect them to do. The truth is that no person can lead any group of people and keep everyone happy about every decision that is made. If you don't believe me, simply read the bible stories of Jesus and his interactions with the disciples or of any of the prophets as they led the people. We just heard from the Gospel of John that many of Jesus' disciples turned and walked away from Jesus and his leadership because it was too hard. The 12 that remained would eventually transform the world by doing what Jesus taught. So good leadership is about understanding that you



are not going to make everyone happy. Furthermore, it is not your job as a leader to make everyone happy. It is the job of a good leader to disappoint those who have entrusted them with leadership at a rate that the people can absorb. The keynote speaker, Rev. Dr. Tod Bolsinger then shared the following definition of his own. "Leadership is energizing a community of people toward their own transformation in order to accomplish a shared mission." This is the type of leader I aspire to be as your Pastor. One who will occasionally disappoint you at a rate you can absorb while at the same time energizing this faith community toward transformation in our faith life in Christ. But what exactly is our "shared mission" as a faith community at Shepherd of the Glades Lutheran Church?

The mission statement of Shepherd of the Glades is, "Transforming lives through the Living Word of God." These few words guide our shared mission. God's word transforms lives every time we gather for Worship. Like the first disciples, the Living Word of Jesus Christ transforms our hearts and our lives. When we leave Worship, we are a new creation filled with the love of God in Christ Jesus and sent into the world to make a positive impact. 2 Corinthians 5:17 says, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" As your Spiritual leader, I see our shared mission of transforming lives not only during Worship, but in the work we do together for the sake of the Gospel. From Sew-Sews creating guilts to provide comfort to those in need; to the food that is blessed and sent to feed the hungry; to sharing the buildings God has given us with AA groups. community groups and two non ELCA Christian Mission congregations; to the grief support groups for those suffering with loss; to providing financial assistance to those who have experienced natural disasters and human made disasters; to supporting local ministries that help children get a good education; AND SO MUCH MORE! Working together in our shared mission as a faith community energizes us and transforms us as we experience Christ's love at work in our world and community. All of this is only possible when everyone works together to accomplish our shared goals. When the staff began planning a volunteer recognition for everyone who gives their time to the church, we recognized that there are nearly 100 people doing all this work. So thank you for your time and energy to make Christ known and transform lives. That is the Good News. Now for the challenging words from your Spiritual leader.

The Christian Church in North America and throughout Europe is experiencing decline in attendance and in participation. We are currently blessed with a stable to slight increase in attendance due to population growth. But I do not believe that trend is sustainable. Some churches have tried techniques and programs that have worked in the past to get people to come to church and found them unsuccessful. So what can the church do to get people to engage in our shared mission? For a fresh perspective on how to be a church in mission, I highly recommend reading "Canoeing the Mountains" by Tod Bolsinger. This book presents a fresh look at why new and innovative church programs are no longer successful. It is my hope that as we seek to be faithful followers of Jesus who are led by the Holy Spirit, we will be open to new ways of thinking about what God is calling us to do. Remember, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. May we be bold in our proclamation of Christ in new and exciting ways as we move forward.


