

SHEPHERD OF THE GLADES LUTHERAN CHURCH (Unapproved) NOVEMBER 12, 2024, COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Members in attendance: Pastor Ungs, Bonny Dery, Penny Morken, Pam Bhathena, Bob Tidmore, Doug Walck, Charlotte Wahlig, Becky McDanel, Brad Caulder, Colleen Hoffman, Gunar Strungs, and John Sherman.

Devotions by: Penny Morken Our discussion questions centered around leading the church in a rapidly changing world. Chapter two of Canoeing the Mountains, Adventure or Die.

- Do you agree with the statement....The world in front of you is nothing like the world behind you? Now, substitute the <u>Church</u> for the word <u>World</u>. Can you think of examples that might fit this statement?
- Using the metaphor of the Lewis & Clark expedition, what does it mean for us as church leaders and for Shepherd of the Glades....Adventure or Die? What might the "adventure" look like? Are we in "uncharted territory"....what does that mean to you? Examples of the "what" and "why" and "How" we go on this Journey?
- In this rapidly changing world, do we seek even more stability, comfort and a sense of control over our lives? How do we feel about our worship experiences? How can we meld that sense of comfort and stability AND begin to embark on new adventures?
- What does missional theology mean to you? What could being a "mission church" look like at Shepherd of the Glades?

A motion to approve the minutes of October 15, 2024, was made, seconded, and approved as written.

<u>Pastor's Report</u> – Official acts of October: Presided at Bill Marderness memorial. Thank you to everyone who helped. Attended required ELCA boundaries workshop. Led Florida Bahamas Synod First Call Theological Education meeting for first call Pastors and deacons.

October has been busy with visiting potential new members, talking with the nominating committee and council members who have the option to remain on the 2025 council, many hospital visits, meeting with the endowment committee regarding distribution of funds, preliminary conversations about budget for next year, and assisting with the Ken Sebe estate gift. We will be receiving 8 new members on Sunday, November 17th. They will meet for a light luncheon, fellowship, and orientation on Friday, November 15th.

Thank you to everyone who helped with Trunk or Treat this year. A new member, Patricia Clark, also joined us. We had over 300 children this year. We gave away business cards, information flyers, and water to adults and a lot of candy to the children. We also invited many people to church.

Thank you to Doug Walck and all who made the Veterans Day recognition Sunday a success.

The annual Caloosa Conference of the Florida Bahamas Synod met at Lamb of God Church in Fort Myers. Penny, Colleen and Pastor Bob also were in attendance. We met the new Director for Evangelical Mission and assistant to the bishop, learned about the 2024 ELCA youth gathering and congregations that were involved, and elected a treasurer and conference dean.

The AVOW Hospice spiritual advisory committee has disbanded and no longer meets due to a staffing change. Met with Mary Winsor to discuss the possibility of becoming an additional staff person. Mary is 23 years old and is the daughter of a Pastor. She has a bachelor's degree and is discerning her call to the church. Mary has served one year on the ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) in Mexico and is fluent in Spanish. This position would be a one-year contract.

Committee Reports:

Endowment-The committee met in October to discuss proposals for endowment awards. It was discussed that due to recent donations to the fund, combined with the investment performance

of the fund, we were able to make several awards. The following awards were discussed and approved. 1. A \$10,000 donation to the Hurricane Helene and Milton Relief Funds, to be distributed through the Bishop of the ELCA Florida/Bahama Synod.

2. A \$10,000.00 donation to the Hurricane Helene Fund targeting specifically the Asheville NC area, to be distributed through the Bishop of the North Carolina Synod. 3. Creation of \$1,000 Roth IRAs (each) for Kelli Ungs and Abraham Ungs, in recognition of their weekly congregation outreach work with the SOTG Lutheran Audio/Visual System, as required for our internet presence. 4. An expenditure of up to \$5,000, as required, to upgrade and modernize the Church AV sound system, to facilitate our internet outreach program. 5. An expenditure of up to \$5,000, as required, to improve, update and maintain the Church internet web site. In addition to the approval of awards, the Committee also discussed a review of our investment manager (ELCA Foundation), specifically to determine if another investment advisor might be more responsive regarding customer service issues, reporting of fund results and offer lower fees for fund management. That review is in progress. Finally, there was discussion regarding designating some of the funds recently received through donations to increase the endowment's baseline funding level. A formal decision has not been made yet. Submitted by: Charlotte Wahlig and Gunar Strungs.

Property-Committee reported 1. Yard debris pile will be picked up after Dec. 1st. 2. Receiving bids for Hansen Hall roof replacement that was damaged by two hurricanes 3. Have figured out a method to install the heavy memorial plaque. It will be scheduled for installation November 26. 4. So far, and we are only into February for the HOA reservations, we have three HOA reservations that require multiple tables and 100 chairs each. More are coming and into April. That is a lot of work for our small committee plus taking care of the exterior. Help would be appreciated. Contact the church office or Doug for scheduling. Also, don't forget the soup supper setups. Fellowship-A planning meeting was held with the current chair, Leslie Beers along with Sue Kautz and Liz McGuire to discuss the Fellowship Committee leadership transition process as Leslie is moving out of state. A meeting was held with Pastor Jeff, Leslie, Followship Chair, and a representative from Hacienda Lakes, a new senior living facility in East Naples. Hacienda Lakes has offered to provide some assistance to help offset financial costs for several planned fellowship activities. More information to follow. First fellowship activity held October 31 – Trunk or Treat and was a success. Candy was donated by the congregation and given to over 300+ children. Nice evening, good crowd of children and their families. Next fellowship event will be November 10 after church services. A special cake/coffee hour to recognize our veterans. Upcoming fellowship events: Assistance with Thanksgiving Dinner scheduled for November 28. The Fellowship Committee will decorate tables on November 27. This Committee will donate \$400 from their budget to assist with food costs for the meal. Christmas Bake Sale is scheduled for December 8 after church services. Submitted by: Penny Morken



ENDOWMENT NEWS...

With thanks for a generous contribution made by a church member, your endowment committee has been very active. This additional donation was providential coming at the same time as hurricane Helene hit Florida and North Carolina. We have been able to support the disaster relief efforts created by hurricanes Helene and Milton in Florida. \$10,000 was donated directly to the synod for its relief work. In North Carolina, \$10,000 was also donated directly to its synod for disaster relief efforts created by hurricane Helene in the Ashville, NC area.

Special Recognition:

Each Sunday we have two people who come to church but they never sit in the pews to worship. WHO are they? Kelli and Abraham Ungs are the team that do the Audio/Visual work that is displayed on the screens and recorded for those who will watch the service online. They are volunteers and want to keep it that way.
