

PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

When we think of February, we often think of Valentine's day and love. As Christians, we are invited to follow Jesus' example of love for one another not only on February 14th, but every day! An expert in the Law of Moses approached Jesus and asked him, "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" I find it interesting that someone who is an expert in the law would even ask this question. We are familiar with the answer Jesus gives. Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." How could someone who is known as being an expert in the law of



Moses and the commandments not know this? Many scholars believe that the expert knew the answer but like the Pharisees and Sadducees he was attempting to trip up or trap Jesus in his teaching. He wanted to demonstrate his power and authority over Jesus. But Jesus was not foolish. He knew the scriptures and he understood that others had been abusing God's Word. They were using the Word of God as a weapon and a tool of justification for their mean spirited actions. The religious leaders even took homes from widows instead of making sure they were cared for by fellow believers. They loved power more than they loved people. Jesus addressed this when he says to the Pharisees and Sadducees, "You are in error because you do not know the Scriptures or the power of God." The power of God is demonstrated through compassion and love for those in need.

No one who is a believer wants to be in error or not know the scriptures or the power of God. So how do we prevent falling into the trap the religious experts had fallen into in the time of Jesus? How do we remain focused on loving God and loving one another as the greatest commandments of God? One obvious way is to listen to or read God's Word daily. We have access to audio bibles online and daily devotions that help us recognize when someone is speaking the Word of God, is a prophet, and when they are abusing God's Word for their worldly gain the way the Pharisees and Sadducees did. I invite you to pick up a daily devotional at the church and to join us for our Wednesday morning bible study from 10-11AM. Each week, we study the readings for the upcoming Sunday. This helps us think about and talk about the scriptures in our modern context before we hear them in worship. Beginning Saturday, February 15th at 1:00 PM I will offer a bible study on the Book of Revelation. This bible study will be focused on God's grace and not the rapture. The rapture is a concept that was not invented until the 1830's. Please let the office know in advance if you plan to attend so that we can have sufficient materials available.

Finally, as I have shared in our stewardship series, actions speak louder than words. The church will offer a ministry fair highlighting the many ways we demonstrate love of God and love of neighbor. But more importantly, God loves you. Happy Valentines day!

Call to order by President Bonny Dery

A motion to approve the minutes of December 10, 2024, was made, seconded, and approved as written.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Thank you and welcome to Bill Nicklay and Sue Kautz, our new 2025 council members. I have no official Pastoral acts to report from December. Christmas Eve Worship candlelight service was wonderful, and I thank Megan for her work in securing special music for the services. Average weekly Worship attendance in December was up by 4 from 2023 and was the highest December attendance average since 2016. However, this includes online attendance.

The executive committee interviewed and hired Mary Winsor as the director for discipleship. She will move here on Friday, January 17th and will be working on Sunday, January 19th. A new grief support group will begin in January. Invitations are being sent out so if you know someone who may be interested, please let me or Lynn know. The adult bible study on the Book of Revelation will begin on Saturday, February 15th. As you can hear in the prayers of the people during Worship, we have had many people who have been hospitalized or had surgery. I have made many hospital and home visits in December, and I do my best to see all our shut ins as often as I am able. I am hopeful that Mary will be able to assist with some of this work.

<u>Treasurers Report</u>: The Truist Investment account increased during December and the income was more than budgeted. December expenses were less than budgeted, and our year-to-date income was less than our year-to-date expenses. This deficit was made up by a withdrawal of funds from the investment account and from 2023 funds.

A motion to approve the Pastor's and Treasurer's reports were motioned for approval, seconded and passed.
