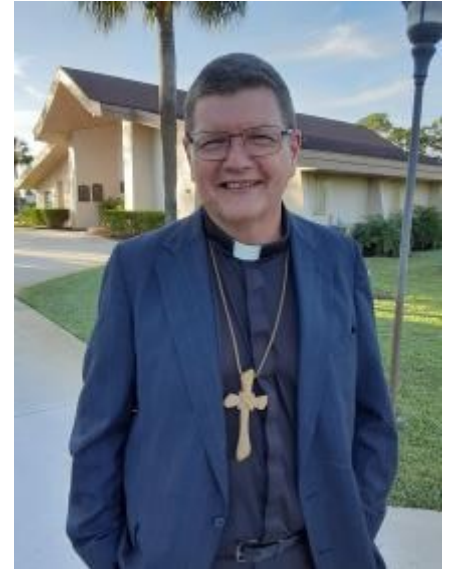

PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

We are in the time of the church calendar known as Lent. Those who have been church nerds all their lives understand that Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We do these things to prepare us for Resurrection Sunday. But I wonder how often we really take the time to unpack our words and really think about the season of Lent. For example, if I ask you how long we observe the season of Lent, you might answer 40 days. But if you are an outsider and not a church nerd, the math doesn't math. If you count the days from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday, it is 46 days! So why do we say Lent is observed for 40 days? And why 46 days and not a Month like some other religions? The answer is complicated.



We say we are observing the season of Lent for 40 days because there is much symbolism in the bible that represents testing, purification, and preparation. Jesus fasted in the wilderness 40 days while being tested by the devil. Noah and his family were saved from the great flood after it rained for 40 days and 40 nights. Moses was on Mount Sinai with God for 40 days and 40 nights as he received the 10 commandments. Moses sent spies to Canaan for 40 days and they confirmed it was the land of milk and honey. Other stories include Goliath taunting Israel for 40 days before David was called by God to defeat Goliath. The Prophet Jonah warned the Ninevites that they would be destroyed in 40 days if they did not repent. There are other biblical stories that utilize 40 days as a time of testing, purification and preparing for what God is about to accomplish. That is the significance of 40 days of Lent. So why the extra 6 days? The six Sundays during Lent are not included because Sunday is the day we celebrate the resurrection! And that is also why we have Sabbath worship on Sunday rather than the traditional Jewish Sabbath of Saturday.

Now that you know why we say 40 days of Lent when there are actually 46 days, and you know that we celebrate Lent by fasting, praying and almsgiving, it is time to unpack what we mean when we say Lent is a time for fasting, praying and almsgiving in preparation for Easter. Fasting is a discipline of abstaining from eating our normal diet. It doesn't have to mean that we eat nothing. We fast to remember the poor who are hungry. We also fast to appreciate that God provides for our daily bread. We are no longer turned inward, but outward towards the needs of others and towards God. When we pray, it is not giving God orders, nor is it simply giving thanks to God. Prayer includes lifting others up who are in need of God's mercy and healing. Prayer is also being quiet and listening to God. Again, prayer turns us towards the needs of others and helps us understand God's desire and plan and helps us become more compassionate towards others. Prayer is a selfless act that recognizes the sovereignty of God and our humanity. And finally Lent is a time for almsgiving. This is not about your offering to the church. Almsgiving is specific. Almsgiving is the act of giving money or food to poor people. We have started the ministry of blessing bags for those we see on the streets who are asking for assistance. When you give a blessing bag to or help someone who is housing insecure, you are performing the act of almsgiving.

Regardless of your discipline this Lent, we say that we encourage prayer, fasting and almsgiving to prepare us for Resurrection Sunday. This is important because it implies that when we are working on our sanctification (living our faith through our daily

actions and words) it helps prepare us for our justification (Salvation through Christ's death and resurrection.) We are not saved through our acts of prayer, fasting and Almsgiving, but these things help us grow closer to the one who gave His life so that we might have eternal life. When we fast we are doing what Jesus did in order that we might become more obedient to God and appreciate the many blessings God has given us. When we pray for others and even on behalf of others we are doing what Jesus did. And when we give assistance to the poor, the needy, and the forsaken we are doing what Jesus did. The kingdom of God is near when we do these things, and it helps us prepare for the celebration of Easter Sunday and the resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Have a blessed Lenten season, and be like Jesus!

A motion to approve the minutes of December 9, 2025, and the Congregational Meeting Minutes were made, seconded and approved as written.

Pastor's Report:

Christmas Caroling after worship on December 21st at Lely was a success. We had many church members join us and Nikki Wykstra led us around to the various residents.

Bible studies: Weekly 10 AM Wednesday bible study. About 10 people are attending in person and online. Marcia Schacht continues to lead the women's bible study and it is very well attended.

Christmas Eve services were well attended. There were 290 in person attendees total with the bulk of that at the 5:00 service. There were also 103 that joined us online.

- Agreed that Lynn Dickerman, Financial Secretary would be the manager of such accounts
- Directed Scott Krenz, Treasurer and Lynn Dickerman, Financial Secretary to take whatever actions are required to transfer Shepherd of the Glades Lutheran Church investment funds currently held by Truist to the newly established Vanguard accounts.
- Directed Scott Krenz, Treasurer and Lynn Dickerman, Financial Secretary to open a savings or money market account with Truist with an initial balance of \$50,000 to serve as immediately available Church operating funds.

A motion to proceed with the resolutions stated above was made, seconded, and approved.

Election of Executive Committee is as follows: President: Penny Morken; Vice-President: Bill Nicklay; Secretary: Pam Bhatena and Treasurer: Scott Krenz.

Standing Committees/Council Liaison Assignments were completed.

Devotional sign-ups have been assigned.

Congregational Support for Seminary applicant. Pastor Jeff explained the candidacy process, which is a very rigorous process for entrance. This is a 4-year process.

The Annual Meeting is scheduled for February 22, 2026, and standing reports are due on February 2, 2026.

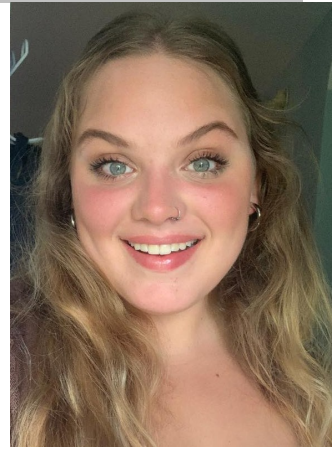

FROM OUR DIRECTOR FOR DISCIPLESHIP . . .

Hello SOTG! Happy March!

I hope all of you are well as we enter into our southern Florida spring season. As I mentioned last month, I submitted all required materials for my candidacy process through the Florida-Bahamas synod. As many of you know, I had an interview with them at the synod office in Tampa, where they asked me many questions regarding my faith and sense of call in the church. At the end, they officially granted me a positive entrance decision before I head off to seminary in August! I have accepted an offer of admission at Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa! It's very exciting because that is where my father and godfather both went to seminary, as well as Pastor Jeff! As of now, I plan to pursue ministry on the ELCA's Word & Service roster, which means that I intend, as of now, to become a deacon in the church. This is a bit different than your traditional pastors who work almost exclusively in congregational contexts. Deacons often serve in ways that are new and innovative, and often in more focused and specialized areas. Sometimes that does mean working in a congregation—maybe in youth and family ministry or music ministry. However, it also means working in the church but outside of the church building. Deacons often find ways to serve populations who may have never entered a church building before. They are more focused on the service aspect of professional ministry and find ways to serve at the intersection of the church and the world. I would like to thank the congregation for all of your support throughout the past year, and for the opportunity to serve you all while I discerned my sense of call to ministry. I am so grateful!



One of the ways that I have been so grateful to serve this year has been through the Blessing Bag ministry! I have been so glad to see how well you all have responded to the idea and how great and excited everyone has been in giving them out to those in need in our community. You all are so generous! Because of that, we will be putting together another round of Blessing Bags after church on Sunday, the 15th! If anyone would like to learn how I buy and organize everything beforehand and help me to do so, I would love that! I hope that the Blessing Bag ministry is something the congregation continues to do in the future!
