PASTOR'S PAGES . . .

Happy 4th of July! I hope your celebration of our nation's 250th birthday is fun and safe. Celebrations are an important part of our life's journey. In June, John Sherman, Mary Stegner, Mary Winsor, and I were all present at our annual Florida-Bahamas Synod Assembly celebration. Each day was filled with wonderful and uplifting worship and workshops. John and Mary got the opportunity to visit with and to get to know Bishop Pedro Suarez during a reception party one evening. Some people may think the Synod Assembly is just a boring meeting of the church, but they would be mistaken. There are business sessions where members of congregations throughout Florida and the Bahamas vote on resolutions, but that is only a small part of what happens at Synod assembly. As a church that is part of the Florida-Bahamas Synod and the ELCA, we have much to celebrate!



Shepherd of the Glades was recognized by the Bishop as a "superstar" congregation for mission support. There were many other superstar and "all star" congregations present at the assembly and each one was recognized and thanked for mission support giving. All star congregations were the congregations that gave what they pledged in mission support. Superstar congregations gave more mission support than pledged. We heard many wonderful stories of how mission support is being used to grow the kingdom of

God. One story of success is that the Florida-Bahamas Synod currently has 35 people who are a part of the candidacy process for ministry. There are 65 Synods in the ELCA, and your Synod has one of the highest number of candidates for ordained ministry! There are 35 people from our Synod attending Seminary! Some will become ordained to Word and Sacrament ministry, and some will be ordained to Word and Service ministry. Some will discern that they are not called to serve the church in an ordained capacity. The candidacy process walks with those who are entering seminary until they are either ordained or leave seminary. It is exciting to have 35 candidates for ordained ministry in our Synod, and we should celebrate. Mary Winsor is now entranced and a part of the candidacy process!

Some other exciting celebrations were the installation of the Summer Camp staff at Luther Springs bible camp, Lutheran Services of Florida sharing their ministry, and a new start up ministry becoming a congregation in our Synod. During one of the worship times, we installed the summer camp staff at Luther Springs. I counted 25 new staff members plus the administrators. All of the summer staff were young, and were very excited to serve the church and share Jesus with others. The image of an old and dying church is not reflective of what we witnessed at assembly. We heard stories about how bible camps continue to grow and serve families and youth with faith development. Luther Springs is part of the Lutheran Outdoor Ministries and they are located near Hawthorn Florida. Let me know if you want to visit some time! When Lutheran Services spoke, we learned that one in five families is somehow assisted with Lutheran Services of Florida (LSF). It is wonderful to know the church is making such a positive and helpful impact on so many families. We have a Lutheran Services of Florida office just a few blocks from the church. If you want to learn more about LSF, please let me know, and we will visit their office. The new mission start church in Florida that was welcomed as a full fledged congregation of the ELCA is located in a brewery! The Hearth brewing community meets every Sunday for worship and Wednesdays with Brewing at The Falcon Bar and Gallery in Orlando, Florida. They have reached many people that traditional churches would have never seen.

It is easy to forget just how many wonderful things continue to happen in the church even in the slower months of summer. Thanks to God and the Good News of Jesus, we have much to celebrate in our journey in life. Thank you for being part of a church community known as Shepherd of the Glades Lutheran Church, ELCA. Thank you for your support of the ministry we share. Have a blessed and safe summer.

SHEPHERD OF THE GLADES LUTHERAN CHURCH MAY 12, 2026, COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES (Unofficial)

Call to order by President Penny Morken. Devotions: Pam Bhathena, Council Secretary

A motion to approve the minutes of April 14, 2026 was made, seconded and approved.

Pastor's Report:

Meetings: -Weekly Staff meetings; Property committee (Air conditioners Hanson Hall) Regular communication with Pastor Orlando Ramirez of Iglesia Conexion; Pastor DJ and Haitian Baptist Church leaders; Bone builders gift presentation; Dinner Church; Caloosa Conference; Merlyn Bowers and Joanne Hogan memorial arrangements; Until we meet again Fellowship planning and funeral dinners.

Bible Studies -Weekly 10:30 AM Wednesday bible study. Women's bible study will continue until attendance is too small. Weekly Sunday school will continue throughout the year during worship.

Grief Support group -Marcia Schacht, Lynn Dickerman and I continue a small group grief support ministry each month. We have now opened this support group for anyone to attend.

Pastoral Calls -Congregation home visits/member visits (4) Home bound communions (5) Hospital/Hospice/clinic/rehab visits (6).

Memorial services -Virginia "Ginger" Jones April 25th, Merlyn Bowers May 9th, Upcoming - Joanne Hogan, May 16th. Thank you to everyone who has assisted with setting up for the memorial services and the fellowship hall.

Pastoral Business- Synod Assembly

Synod assembly is June 4th - 6th in Orlando. John and Mary Sherman and Mary Winsor will be our voting members. I will also be away June 2nd-4th for the Synod First Call theological education support team as a teacher and mentor. First call Pastors and Deacons are required to attend classes their first three years in a call. This is in addition to their other requirements.

Pastor's time away -Synod assembly is June 4th-6th. Since I have to be at the Synod Assembly on the 2nd, I will not be available June 2nd-6th. I will be back to preach and preside on the 7th and 14th. I will be available via my cell phone for emergencies. I will be taking vacation time June 15th -25th. Mary will be available as an initial contact for emergencies. I will also be taking vacation time August 6th -10th for the Baptism of a Grandson.

A/V update -The installation of two cameras, additional microphones that will pick up the congregation responses and singing, and new Bluetooth hearing aid devices are being installed May 12-15th. I have been seeking volunteers to train in the A/V room when Abraham and Kelli are not available. If you or anyone you know might be interested, please let me know.

Fire alarm system monitoring -The company we currently have monitoring the church for fire emergencies has not inspected nor communicated with us nor have they done an inspection for a year and a half. I am recommending we switch to CINTAS for all our fire protection.

Director of Discipleship Report:

-We hosted our first Dinner Church. It went very well with 27 people in attendance, including volunteers. We had attendees from 3 different circles, including: AA groups, Bone Builders, and St. Peter's Catholic Church. The evening went smoothly and according to schedule. Everyone was fed well and able to take leftovers home with them. The "Jesus story" time and skit was a success and fostered great and meaningful conversations at all the tables. Attendees expressed their gratitude for the evening and said they look forward to coming back. Some already had plans to invite people they know next month. Our meal for next month is already planned, and the volunteer who will cook is confirmed. The Jesus story and questions have yet to be determined.

COUNCIL CORNER (CONTINUED) . . .

I will continue to reach out to community organizations with the hope of reaching more people. We continue to look for more volunteers to help plan, organize, and lead as the ministry continues to evolve. We had our third and final coaching meeting for Dinner Church, wrapping up the required training/coaching sessions as determined by the grant agreement. Our first report to the synod on how the ministry is going is due at the beginning of June. - **Took quilts** from Sew Sews to St. Matthew's House. The other half will be taken to the women's shelter in the coming weeks. The total for this year was 54. - **Continue to schedule** the ushers and communion assistants for each Sunday. - **Continue to attend** weekly Bible studies and Sew Sews meetings. - **Pastor Jeff and I** have decided that on Sunday, June 21st, I will preach while he is away for vacation time. - **During service on Sunday, June 28th**, the Endowment Committee will officially award me the grant money that I will use for seminary expenses.

Treasurers Report: April's financial results were roughly in line with budget. Offerings through the first four months were in line with prior year. Year to date, we are behind budget as a result of revenue being consistent with prior year while expenses have increased modestly as a result of overall inflation. The Church's reserve funds have continued to benefit from a robust investment market. The Church remains on a firm financial foundation. Submitted by Scott Krenz

The group will now meet once a month from June through September, with dates being determined by the availability of members. They will start back up full time in mid-October. That request can be brought to Council for approval at this time as well, or pending until the paperwork is received, depending on the Council's preference. Property Committee: The sprinkler system on North side of Hansen Hall is not working. The committee will work on installing/repairing the sprinkler system. Submitted by Bill Nicklay.

Evangelism Report: Grace Place: We have 75 backpacks ready for Grace Place to pick up. Penny has sent Grace Place an email notifying them. Pickup from the church will be between June 29 and July 10. I have agreed to be the point person along with Becky McDanel's help. We will have a signup sheet for anyone wanting to participate in the festivities at Grace Place. There is \$1,000 left in the budget to purchase backpacks which typically go on sale in the fall. I recommend that the team continue with this project in the coming year. **Blessing Bags:** There are 120 Blessing Bags that should be distributed before October due to expiration dates on the food items. We will discuss whether this project should continue after the supply is
